1: Safety Information

Thank you for purchasing this state of the art TV and DVD. Please carefully read this manual before installing and using the tv. Keep this manual handy for future reference. If the tv is damaged in transit do not attempt to use it, but contact the supplier immediately.

2: Safety Precautions



Unpacking and Handling. Open the carton carefully and remove the top polyfoam packing. Carefully lift the Tv (2 persons) and place onto a firm stable surface. Lift off the Poly bag and retain all packaging for future use. Keep all packaging away from small children and animals.



Placing Tv. The tv should be placed on a firm table or shelf. Do not place in a cabinet unless there is sufficient spacing for air flow and access for the DVD player opening.



Connections. When connecting the tv to external sources and the mains supply, do not place wires that can be tripped over. Do not place heavy objects, bend or trap the mains lead.



Top of Tv. Do not place objects such as vases, candles or other objects which may spill into the Tv.



Ventilation and Heat Sources. Do not place material over the ventilation slots, this will cause the tv to overheat and fail. Do not place the Tv in direct sunlight or near heat sources such as radiators or fires.



Moisture. Do not place the Tv in wet or damp conditions, such as steamy kitchens, basements or other damp places. Do not allow water or other fluids to enter the Tv. Do not touch the Mains plug with wet hands. Should moisture enter the Tv , disconnect from the supply and call the customer help line.



Cleaning. Disconnect the Tv from the mains supply. Use a soft dry cloth, for stubborn stains use a soft moist cloth with a dilute mild detergent.. Do NOT use petrol based fluids



Leaving your Tv. Do not leave your tv operating whilst un attended. It is wise to switch off at the Power switch. To conserve power do not leave the tv in standby for long periods "overnight". When leaving the tv for long periods "holidays" and when local thunderstorms occur, discon- nect the aerial "if external" and mains supply.






LCD TV Set

5: TV Installation Connections


Power Cord Connection

Connect the mains plug into the mains supply connector and switch on. Turn on the mains switch at the front lower right side of the TV, a red led will be displayed and the TV is in standby. Press the "POWER" button on the side of the TV and it will come out of standby, the led will turn green. The AKURA Logo wil be displayed and then the TV screen will go black for approx 10 seconds, this is normal. After the delay the TV will operate normally.



Antenna Connection


Insert the TV Antenna plug into the rear of the TV as shown. For best results an external (outdoor) antenna is recommended. DVBt (digital) signals need to be of high quality. If your antenna system is old it may need replacing.



SCART Connection


Connect a SCART lead (not supplied) from the DVD/VCR and to the SCART connector on the TV.

Select SCART using the SOURCE button of the TV.




YPbPr Connection

Connect the Y PbPr output of the DVD, VCR or other item to the Y PbPr input on the TV. (lead not supplied). The picture quality will be improved, compared with SCART or AV input. Connect the Audio output of the DVD,VCR or other item to the Audio input sockets of the TV, using a stereo RCA cable , (not supplied). Select Y,Pb,Pr using the SOURCE button on the remote control or TV. Do not connect more than one video cable to each item as this may cause interference on the picture.




S-Video Connection

Connect the S_VIDEO output of the DVD, VCR or other item, to the S-VIDEO input on the TV. The picture quality will be improved compared with SCART or AV input. Connect the Audio output of the DVD, VCR or other item to the Audio input sockets on the TV using a stereo RCA cable (not supplied). Select S-VIDEO using the SOURCE button on the remote control or TV. Do not connect more than one video cable to each item as this may cause interference on the picture.




VGA Connection

Connect the VGA output from your PC to the VGA input of the TV. If you are using sound, connect the PC audio to the TV PC audio input (leads not supplied). Use the SOURCE button to select VGA



HDMI Connection

Connect HDMI output from DVD/VCR or X box or similar to the TV and use the "SOURCE" button to select HDMI 1. (Lead not supplied)



CAM (Conditional Access Module)

Using a CAM (Conditional Access Module) (CI Slot).

This feature allows the user to access digital terrestrial "pay per view" channels. To use the facility a conditional access module (CAM) and viewing card need to be obtained by subscribing to a pay channel company.

To insert the module, Ensure the TV is fully disconnected from the power source.

Insert the CAM into the CI slot ensuring that the label is facing towards the "wall" see Fig 1. A positive stop should be felt if correctly fitted. DO NOT force the module.

To release the CAM hold the two sides with fingers and pull gently.

Re connect the TV to the power and switch on. Select DTV

Insert your "Pay per view" card, "do NOT touch the gold contacts".

Press the MENU button and enter the TUNING menu. Select CI Information and press ENTER. (Fig 2) Select Module Information and press ENTER (Fig 3) To see the card information, select Card Information and press ENTER.

If everything is working satisfactorily you should see the information similar to Fig 4.

Exit the menu's by pressing MENU or let the TV time out automatically and you are ready to view "pay per view".

To obtain the CAM and pay per view card, these may be purchased from good high street stores.



6. REMOTE CONTROL

Remote control instructions in TV mode



POWER

Turns Tv on and back to Standby

MUTE

Press to mute the sound. Press again or press V+ to un-mute the TV.

SOURCE

Press to display SOURCE Menu. Press ▼/▲ to select the required source and press ENTER.

PMODE

Press repeatedly to cycle through the available video picture modes.

SMODE

Press to cycle through the different sound settings.

AUDIO(I/II)

Selects NICAM or Mono if transmitted SLEEP

Press to select time TV will switch off to standby

NUMBER BUTTONS

Press 0 – 9 and 10,+10 to select TV channels directly.

LIST

Press to display the TV program list.

Return to the previous channel viewed.

DISPLAY(INFO)

Press to display the source and channel's information.

INFO

Shows information about the current channel.

THUMBSTICK(▲/ ▼/ ◀ / ▶ / OK ENTER)

Allows you to navigate the on-screen menus and adjust the system settings to your preference.

TV MENU

Displays the operating menu

Exit the main TV menu

Press to increase / decrease the sound level.



Remote control setup

- 1. Open the battery cover
- 2. Fit two "AAA" batteries (Not supplied). Ensure the battery polarities are correct i.e + to + and to -.
- 3. Replace the battery cover

To prevent injury, do NOT break open or throw exhausted batteries in a fire. Do not place in the domestic waste, consult your local waste disposal company.

Do not mix batteries, old and new, Carbon or Alkaline.


Do not use re chargeable batteries.

Remove batteries if not using the remote control for long periods to prevent leakage. If the batteries do leak, clean the compartment with soapy water and scrape any residue from the contacts. To NOT touch or ingest battery residue.

CHANNEL Menu




Press ▲/▼ to select the item required and ▶ or **OK** to confirm

Press **MENU** to return to a previous menu

Press **EXIT** to exit the menu's

Auto tuning



Press **◄/▶** to select the country, then OK to confirm. When it is Auto Tuning, press MENU to skip the current tuning (ATV or DTV), or EXIT to return to the previous menu.

DTV Manual Tuning



Press ◀▶ to select the channel, then OK to search.

ATV Manual Tuning



Press ▲/▼ to select. Press ◀/▶ to adjust as required. See details in the following sub–option. Select **SAVE** and press **ENTER/OK**

To Store.

Press **◄/▶** to select the channel number you want to save to.

System.

Press **◄**/▶to select the sound system. In the UK it is "I", Western Europe "B/G", Eastern Europe "D/K". Parts of France "L" or "LL".

Current Channel.

Press **◄/**▶to select the current channel number.

Search

Press **◄/▶** to search up or down. Press **MENU** or **EXIT** to stop search.

Fine Tune.

Press **◄**/▶to adjust the Fine tuning, normally this will not require adjustment, unless you have sound or picture interference.

Skip.

Press ◀/▶to turn Skip On or Off. When Skip is On, the CH+/CH- buttons will not select that channel, however the numeric buttons will still select "skipped" channels.

Frequency.

Displays the frequency of the currently selected channel.

Program Edit



Delete

Press ▲ ▼ to select the channel you want to delete, then press DELETE (RED), and the channel will be marked DELETE, press DELETE (RED) again to delete, or MENU to cancel.

Rename.

Press $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$ to select the channel you want to rename. Press (Green) "Rename" to mark the selected channel. Press $\blacktriangleleft/\blacktriangleright$ to select the position in the word, then press $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$ to select the letter or number required. To exit, press **EXIT** or wait for the menu to "time out".

Move.

Press ▲/▼ to select the channel you want to move, press (Yellow) "Move", this marks the channel you wish to move. Press ▲/▼ to select the location you want to move to. Press Menu or Exit to cancel.

Skip.


Press ▲/▼ to select the channel you want to Skip, press (Blue) "Skip" to mark that channel. To "un skip" that channel press (Blue) again.

When Skip is selected P+/P- will not select that channel, however the numeric buttons will still select that channel.

Favourite.

Press ▲/▼ to select the channel you want to add to the Favourites List, then press **FAV** to mark or "un mark" that channel. Any channel marked FAV will be added to the Favourites list

PICTURE menu



Press **MENU** to display the Menu, press **▼** to select the **PICTURE** menu, Press **▼** to enter the sub menu.

Press **MENU** to return to the main menu from the sub menu.

Picture Mode

Press ◀▶ to select picture mode. Select from:- Dynamic, Standard, Mild, User. Press OK to confirm and return to the previous menu.

Contrast

Press **◄** to adjust the contrast.

Brightness

Press **◄** ► to adjust the brightness.

Colour

Press **◄** to adjust the colour saturation.

Sharpness

Press ◀▶to adjust the sharpness.

Color Temperature

Press ◀▶ to select Color Temperature. Cool, User, Warm, Medium





Noise Reduction.

Press ◀▶ to turn On or Off the Noise Reduction

Screen. (only available in PC mode).





Auto Adjust. Select "Auto Adjust" and press ▶, the unit will automatically adjust all settings to achieve the best effect. "the picture will "jitter" for a few seconds).


H-Position. Allows you to use the **◄▶** buttons to manually adjust the H position.

Press ◀▶ to select the sound mode, Music, Movie, Sport, User and Standard.

Press **OK** to confirm and return to the previous menu.

Treble.

Press **◄** ► to adjust the Treble level.

Bass.

Press **◄** ► to adjust the Bass level.

Balance.

Press **◄**▶ to adjust the balance level.

Auto Volume.

Press **◄**▶ to select On or Off.

Surround Sound.

Press ◀▶ to select On or Off.

TIME menu



Press **ENTER** to display the main menu and press **▼** to select the **TIMER** menu, press **▼** to enter the sub menu.

Press **MENU** to return to the main menu.

Clock.

Press ► to select Date, Month, Year, Hour and Minutes, press ▲ ▼ ◀► to set the time. (note :- this is set automatically in DTV mode).

Off time.

Press ► to select On or one of the features listed in the menu, press ▲ ▼ ◀► to set the time the TV is to be turned Off. This is a "Stand alone" function. It will not work in conjunction with the "On Time" setting.

On time.

Press ► to select On or one of the features listed in the menu, press ▲ ▼ ◀► to set the time the TV is turned On. This is a "Stand alone" function. It will not work in conjunction with the "Off Time" setting.

Sleep Timer.

Allows you to set the Sleep Timer from :- 10 min, 20 min, 30 min, 60 min, 90 min, 120 min, 180 min, 240 min and off.

Auto Sleep.

Automatic shutdown function of timing options.

Time Zone.

Allows you to set the "Time Zone" default is London GMT.

Note :This TV does not recognise British Summer Time (BST). To operate the timer in BST mode select "Belgium" (+ 1 hr).

Press **MENU** to display the main menu, press ▶ to select the **OPTION** menu, press ▼ to enter the sub menu. **Language**

Press **◄**▶ to select , OSD, Audio and Sub titles languages.


Country.

Press ◀▶ to select the country the TV is to be used in. It is set to UK default.

Restore Factory Default.

Press ▶ to reset the factory settings.

LOCK menu



Press **MENU** to display the main menu, press ► ◀ to select **LOCK**. Press ▼ and a request to enter the PIN number "0000" will be shown. Enter the PIN number and the Lock Sub menu will be displayed. Use the ▲ ▼ buttons to select the item required.

Press **MENU** to return to the main menu.

Lock Channel.

Press ◀▶ to select On or Off.

Set Password.

Press ► to enter the sub menu. Select four memorable digits and enter again to confirm. Should you forget your new password, see Technical Help Guide on page 33.


Block Program.

Select CHANNEL LOCK and press ► This will display the Channel list. Select the channel to lock using the ▲/▼ buttons, and press GREEN. A Lock will be displayed along side the locked channel. To unlock, press GREEN again. Parental Guidance.

In DTV mode, press **◄** ► to select Parental Guidance grade.

EPG Menu

Use the **EPG** button on the remote control to display the **EPG** menu directly as shown below. (note this function only works in DTV mode.




Fast Channel List



Press the List button to enter into the Channel list directly.

Press SOURCE to display the INPUT SOURCE list. Press ▲ ▼ to select the input required and press OK to confirm.

INPUT SOURCE



Basic operation

1. Select DVD.

Turn on the TV and press the SOURCE button and then the ▲/ ▼to select DVD. Press OK to confirm.

2. Playing discs.


Insert the disc with the label facing AWAY from you. The disc will either automatically start to play, or will display a menu. Use the navigation buttons to select the item you require and press OK.

3. Program playback

Using Program playback, you can select max. 16 chapters from the disc to playback in programmed order. OSD for program playback as below.

Digital Audio/JPEG Playback

After loading and scaning the Digital Audio / JPEG CD&DVD, it will initially display the - Digital Audio contents automatically and start to play the first file (highlighted file). Screen as follow:



- Using the navigation buttons enables you to select the folder, press OK and then select the file you want to play.


NOTE:

- Press ◀ ▶ buttons to move the highlighted files to folders, documents or mode selection.
- Press numeric buttons to select the contents directly. For number over 10, press +10 button first. (e.g. File number 15, press +10 then 5.)
- When playing Digital Audio files, there is no picture display, only audio output.
- Playing JPEG discs: Press the PROGRAM button to select slide effects. There are 17 slide modes, press the PROGRAM button to toggle between different modes in sequence. (Start from top Start from bottom Start from left Start from right Start from upper left corner Start from upper right corner Merge from left / right Horizontal blades Vertical blades Merge form 4 corners Random Playback Slide effect OFF).
- When playing or pauseing images, you may use navigation buttons to flip / rotate the picture.
 - button to flip horizontally.
 - V button to flip vertically.
 - button to rotate left 90°.
 - button to rotate right 90°.
- When playing or pausing images, you may use the D.MENU button to enter preview mode to dislay 12 pictures.

 Press⊌4 / ▶ button to select next / previous page or press numeric buttons to view the corresponding pictures.
- The maximum JPEG image size that can be displayed is 1280 x 1024.

Function Settings

DVD Function General setup




- Press the DVD SETUP button to activate the DVD player OSD menu;
- Press ▲ / ▼ buttons to move and highlight between different sub-menus. Press ◀ / ▶ ENTER button to enter the highlighted sub-menu.
- Press DVD SETUP button to exit the OSD menu.

System Setup

TV SYSTEM

- Press ▶ button to enter the TV SYSTEM, and then press ▲ / ▼ to select one from below:



AUTO (Default setting)

This format can be used if your DVD is capable of both PAL and NTSC formats.

PAL

This is the format used in UK for example.

NTSC


This format is used by some other countries, e.g. USA

SCREEN SAVER

If the screen saver option is on, when your DVD player is in Stop, Open, or No Disc state, or there is a frame frozen for more than 60sec, the screen saver will be displayed. This feature can protect the screen from damage.


ON: Choose this setting to activate the screen saver.

OFF: Choose this setting to cancel the screen saver



TV TYPE

DVD's are produced in a variety of screen aspect ratios. This menu enables you to select one of the three aspect ratios:




- 4:3 PS (Normal)
- 4:3 LB (Normal)
- 16:9 (Wide)
- Select the most appropriate aspect ratio for the JPG being viewed.

NOTE:

- Playback screen size may vary according to the disc contents.
- For media with 4:3 contents, using any mode would only display a 4:3 screen
- Screen ratio selection should be according to the connected TV / Display aspect ratio.

PASSWORD


- The default setting is locked. No Rating selection or change password could be done. To edit the Rating setting, please enter default password "0000" using the numeric buttons, then press ENTER button to confirm.
- To change password, input any 4 digit number when the lock is unlocked. Once the 4 digit number is entered, that will be your new password.



RATING


You can select the rating setting according to your preference. Rating restriction is divided into eight different category from KID SAFE to ADULT.

NOTE: Only editable when password is unlocked.




POWER RESUME

Select "ON" and the disc will resume paying from where it was stopped. Select "OFF" the disc will start playing from the start.




SOURCE






AUDIO COMPRESSION SETTINGS

DYNAMIC RANGE



- Switch the compress mode to "Audio output" to adjust the compress ratio for different effects. When selected FULL, the peak signal value is smallest. When selected OFF, the peak signal value is largest.

DUAL MONO



 You can select four different audio output, STEREO, MONO L, MONO R, MIX MONO. The audio out description of these Selections is shown in the table below.

USB and SD Card Reader

This TV has the added feature of USB and SD Card inputs. This allows the user to play music files, photographs and any other digital data stored on either a USB memory stick or SD memory card.

The inputs are situated adjacent to the manual DVD control buttons on the right side of the TV. (see page 6)

The TV must be in DVD mode to enter the USB/SD mode.

Insert either the USB or SD card or both if required into the slots. Note the SD card can only be fitted one way, with the gold contacts facing you as seen in Fig 1

To select the source, the TV is defaulted to "AUTO". If you place either a USB or SD card into the respective slots the TV will automatically select that input. With no input DVD is selected.

To manually select an input, Press the DVD SETUP (RED) button on the remote control and you will see a menu as in Fig 2. Scroll down to "SOURCE" with the ▼ button and to enter the sub menu press the ▶ button. To select the required input use the ▲/▼ buttons and press ENTER to confirm.

When either a USB or SD card is selected the TV will take a few seconds to read the contents and then display something similar to that in Fig 3.

The field on the Left shows the "Directory" and the field on the right shows the files in that directory. To navigate the fields use the $\blacktriangle \blacktriangledown \blacktriangleleft \blacktriangleright$ buttons.

To return to DVD operation, simply remove the memory device or select DVD in the SOURCE menu.





10. DISC CARE

About Disc Terms

Title

Generally, pictures or music compressed on a DVD are divided into several sections, "title"

Chapter

The smaller section unit of picture or music in a DVD under the title, usually one title is comprised of one or more chapters and each of them is numbered for easy searching, but some discs may not have a recording chapter.

Track

A segment of picture or music on a CD, Each track is numbered for searching.

Care of Disc

Video disc contains high-density compressed data that needs proper handling.

- Hold the disc with fingers by outer edge and/or the center spindle hole. Do not touch
 the discs surface.
- Do not bend or press the disc.







Do not expose the disc to direct sunlight or heating sources, Stere discs in cabinet vertically, and in dry condition.

Prevent exposure to:

Direct sunlight

Heat or exhaust from a heating device

Extreme humidity

Clean the disc surface with a soft, dry cleaning cloth, Wipe the disc surface gently and radically from center toward the outer edge.

Do not apply thinner, alcohol, chemical solvent, or sprays when cleaning. Such cleaning fluids will permanently damage the disc surface.

11. Wall Mounting.

The TV is provided with four mounting holes (6mm isometric threads) for a wall mounting bracket. (not supplied).

To remove the TV base, unscrew the 2 screws in Fig 1 and lift the base away from the Tv. Mount the bracket using the manufacturers instructions. Do NOT use mounting screws longer than 16mm.

Fit the wall bracket securely following the manufacturers instructions.

12. Useful Information.

Power Consumption Reduction.

To enable the user to reduce the "carbon footprint" of the Tv, it is suggested that the Tv is turned off completely at the mains supply or the mains switch on the TV, rather than be left in standby when not in use. This not only reduces the carbon footprint, it increases the safety of the product and it also reduces the annual electricity bill by a significant amount.

HDMI SETUP

If you are using HDMI for the first time, from a DVD player or similar item, you may need to set the "source" output. To do this connect a "SCART" lead and the HDMI lead from the item to the TV, Select SCART1 (if SCART 1 is used). Enter the setup menu of the external item (see manufacturers guide) and select the HDMI output. Select HDMI input on the TV and you should see a picture from the external item. When your setup is complete, remove the SCART lead.

Display.

The display contains over 1 million pixels. Do NOT hit or physically damage the screen surface. It is normal, within the lifetime of the screen to see bright or dark pixels. This is not a fault and is not covered by warranty.

Service Port.

This connector is intended for service personnel only. Do NOT place any USB item into this port. You may upset the internal firmware. Unauthorised programming will invalidate your warranty.
