Operations in these instructions are described mainly with the remote control, but you can do the operations on the main unit if the controls are the same.

The remote control

Batteries



- Insert so the poles (+ and -) match those in the remote control.
- Do not use rechargeable type batteries.

- Do not:**
- Mix old and new batteries.
 - Use different types at the same time.
 - Heat or expose to flame.
 - Take apart or short circuit.
 - Attempt to recharge alkaline or manganese batteries.
 - Use batteries if the covering has been peeled off.
- Mishandling of batteries can cause electrolyte leakage which can damage items the fluid contacts and may cause a fire.

Remove if the remote control is not going to be used for a long period of time. Store in a cool, dark place.

If you cannot operate the unit or television using the remote control after changing the batteries, please re-enter the codes (television → page 11, main unit → page 42).

Use
Aim at the sensor, avoiding obstacles, at a maximum range of 7 m (23 feet) directly in front of the unit.

Features

This Recordable DVD Home Theater System allows you to enjoy high quality video and audio recordings providing you with a complete home entertainment package.

■ A variety of discs can be played

In addition to DVD-Video movies, this unit can play a variety of discs including multi-channel DVD-Audio, audio CDs, and Video CDs. You can also play MP3 files recorded on CD-R and CD-RW discs.

■ Editing your recording **RAM**

- You can divide programs (⇒ page 31).
- Use play lists (⇒ page 27) to select your favorite scenes and rearrange them to play in any order you like.

■ Enjoying television programs in surround sound

- You can enjoy recorded and broadcast television programming in surround sound with Dolby Pro Logic II.
- You can also enjoy satellite television and CATV digital multi-channel audio by connecting with an optical cable.

■ Exceptional sound and picture quality when recording

- Audio is recorded using Dolby Digital stereo, enabling high quality sound recordings. When recording in XP mode it is possible to use LPCM (2 channel) to achieve sound recordings of even higher quality.
- The encoder system used for recording is called "Hybrid VBR" and allows high quality recordings.

■ Fast access to the program you want to watch (⇒ page 19) **RAM DVD-R**

Use the Direct Navigator to find a program you have recorded and start play.

■ Make your own DVD-Video

Finalizing a DVD-R that has been recorded on produces an original DVD-Video in accordance with DVD-Video standards.

■ Maximum 12 hours on DVD-RAM

- Using a double sided, 9.4 GB DVD-RAM allows you to record a maximum of 12 hours (6 hours continuously).
- You can also use the FR (Flexible Recording) mode to fit recordings efficiently onto the available space on the disc.

■ Progressive Scan

By connecting the component video terminal of this unit to a progressive scan television, it is possible to enjoy the high quality picture rendered by the progressive scan function.

■ Quick View (⇒ page 20) **RAM**

You can speed up play to make checking the contents faster. Both video and sound are played faster.

■ The FUNCTIONS window shows you most of the features you can use (⇒ page 25)

The FUNCTIONS window has most of the features and functions you are likely to use regularly. Just select the icon for the operation you want to perform.

■ Watch a program while you are recording it (⇒ page 17) **RAM**

Chasing Play

You can watch a program from the start while you are still recording it.

Simultaneous rec and play

You can record a program while watching one you recorded previously.

Time Slip

You can jump back to review a piece of action you missed while recording by pressing the time slip button.

- During playback, you can specify a length of time to jump to the scene you wish to view.

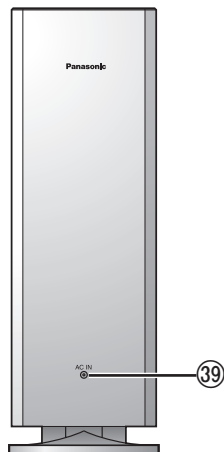
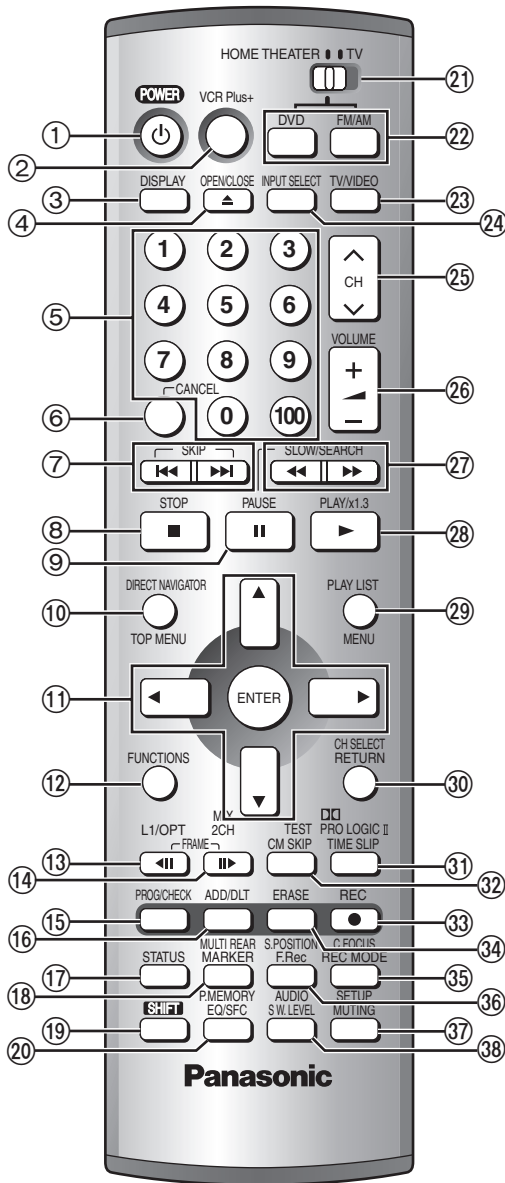

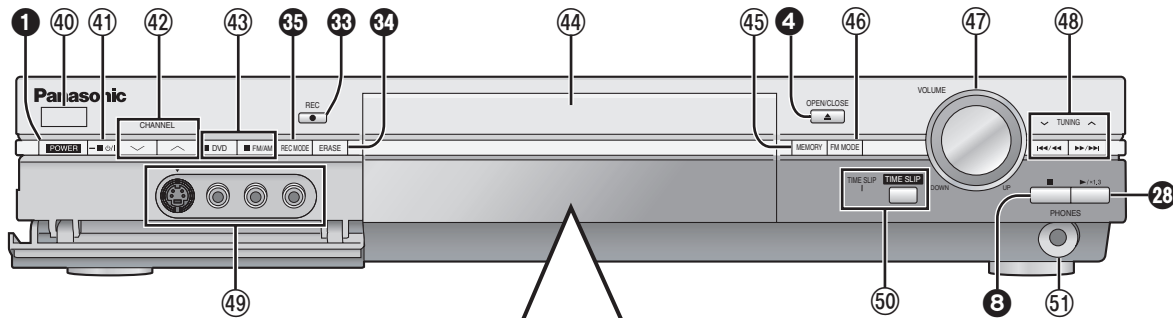

- We recommend using Panasonic discs as they have been confirmed to be compatible with this unit. Other discs may not perform correctly.
- Do not allow the disc to become dirty or scratched. Fingerprints, dirt, dust, scratches or deposits of cigarette smoke on the recording surface may make it impossible to use the disc for recording.
- Discs with programs recorded in PAL already cannot be recorded on with this unit.
- This unit is compatible with the **Content Protection for Recordable Media (CPRM)** (⇒ page 51) system so you can record broadcasts that allow one copy, such as some CATV broadcasts, onto 4.7 GB/9.4 GB DVD-RAM (these are CPRM compatible). It is not possible to record onto DVD-R or 2.8 GB DVD-RAM.

■ DVD-RAM

- **DVD-RAM recorded on this unit may not be compatible with other DVD players, including some Panasonic players. Consult the manual for the player to determine compatibility with these DVD-RAM discs.**
- This unit is compatible with both non-cartridge and cartridge DVD-RAM, but the write-protect tabs on cartridge-type discs give better protection to your recordings.
- Picture aspect ratios, regular 4:3 or widescreen 16:9, are recorded as they are received.

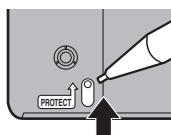
■ DVD-R

- **In order to play a DVD-R recorded using this unit on another playback source, the disc must first be finalized (⇒ page 33).**
- Once a DVD-R is finalized, it becomes DVD-Video.
- You can record onto the available space on the disc and perform editing functions, such as giving titles to discs and programs and erasing programs before finalizing.
- When programming is erased from a DVD-R, that space does not become available. Once an area on a DVD-R is recorded on, that area is no longer available for recording, whether the recording is erased or not.
- It takes about 30 seconds for the unit to complete recording management information after recording finishes.
- This unit optimizes the DVD-R for each recording. Optimizing is carried out when you start recording after inserting the disc or turning on the unit. Recording onto the disc may become impossible if optimizing is carried out too many times.
- The video is recorded in a 4:3 aspect irrespective of the video signal input.
- Play may be impossible in some cases due the condition of the recording.
- A DVD-R recorded on this unit may not be recordable on other Panasonic DVD recorders.





■ Protection **RAM**

You can protect the contents of your discs in the following ways.

- **Cartridge-protect:**
With the write-protect tab in the protect position, you cannot record to, edit, or erase from the disc. (Type 1, 2, and 4 cartridge discs)
- **Program-protect** (⇒ page 30)

- This unit can play CD-R/CD-RW (audio recording disc) recorded with CD-DA (digital audio), video CD (video CD format 2.0) or MP3. Close the sessions or finalize the disc after recording. Play may be impossible on some CD-R or CD-RW discs due to the condition of the recording.
- The producer of the material can control how DVD-Video and Video CDs are played. So you may not always be able to control play as described in these operating instructions. Read the disc's instructions carefully.

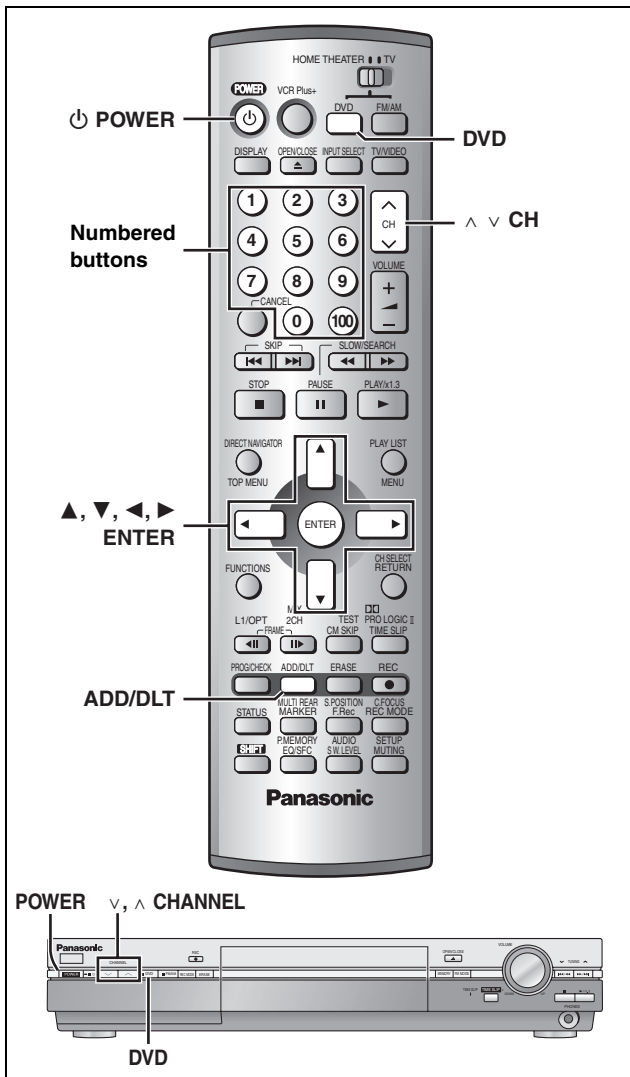

■ Disc structure

Disc structure and the labels given to the items on discs depend on the disc type.

- Group:** collections of tracks on DVD-Audio and equivalent to folders or albums on data discs.
- Title:** the largest division on DVD-Video, usually an entire movie.
- Program:** the division on DVD-RAM equivalent to a single recording.
- Play list:** a group of scenes on DVD-RAM.
- Scene:** DVD-RAM program sections specified and grouped into play lists on a DVD video recorder.

STEP 1 Plug-in Auto Tuning



After plugging the unit into your household AC outlet and pressing [POWER] to turn the unit on for the first time, the unit assists you to set the menu language, and automatically tunes in all the channels it can receive and sets the clock.

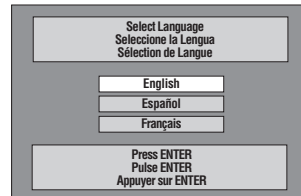

Inserting discs

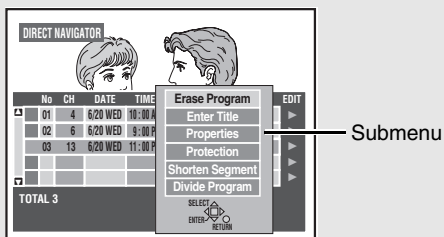
Common procedures

Release protection before proceeding with “Erase Program”, “Enter Title”, “Protection”, “Shorten Segment” or “Divide Program”. **RAM**

(Cartridge → page 8, disc → page 32)

- 1** Press [**DIRECT NAVIGATOR**].
- 2** Press [**▲**, **▼**] to select the program.
You can also select programs with the numbered buttons.
e.g., “5”: [0] → [5]
- 3** Press [**▶**] so the submenu appears.



- 4** Press [**▲**, **▼**] to select the item and press [**ENTER**].

To clear the program list

Press [**DIRECT NAVIGATOR**].

To stop set up process

Once a program is erased, divided, or a segment is shortened, it cannot be restored to its original state. Make certain before proceeding.

- Once a program is erased or a segment is shortened, the play list which was created from that program is also erased.

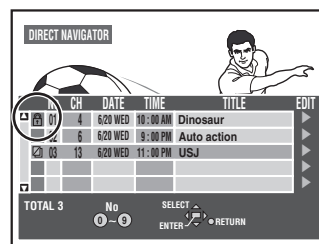

- The disc's available recording time may not increase after erasing short segments.

Divide Program

RAM

Select a point at which to divide the program into two.

- 5 Press [ENTER] at the point you want to divide the program.



To confirm the division point

Press [▲, ▼] to select “Preview” and press [ENTER]. (Play will begin from a point 10 seconds prior to and after the division point.)

To change the division point

Restart play and press [▲, ▼] to select “Divide”, then press [ENTER] at the point you want to change.

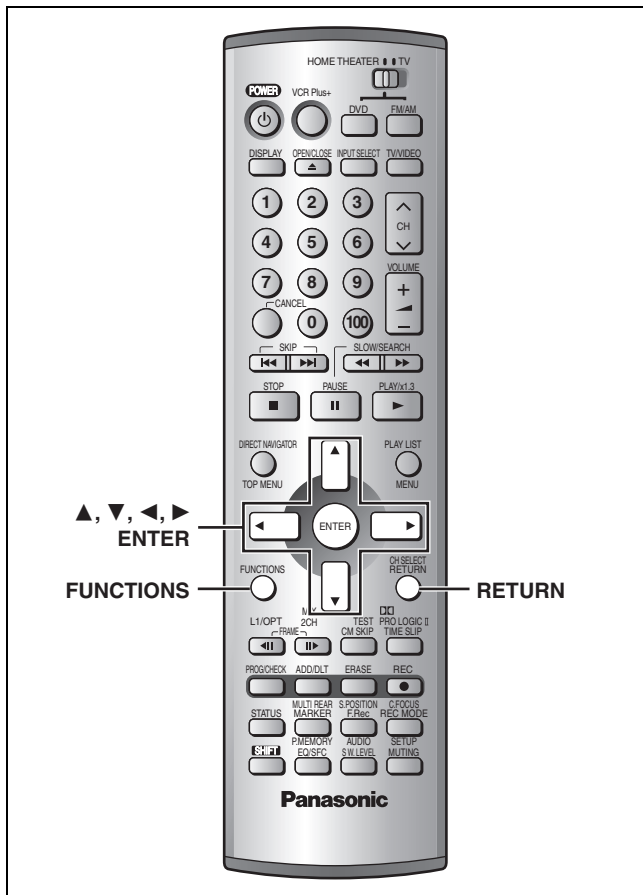
- 6 Press [▲, ▼] to select “Exit” and press [ENTER].

The program is divided.

- The divided programs retain the title and CPRM property (→ page 51) of the original program.

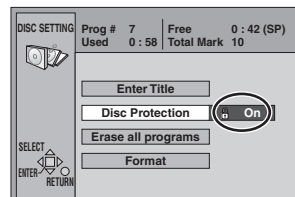

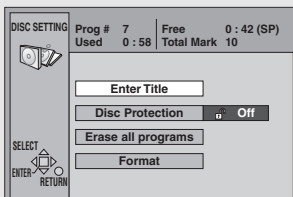

- Erase does not work if one or more programs are protected.

Once all programming has been erased or the disc has been formatted, the contents cannot be restored. Check carefully before proceeding.

Format

RAM

Some DVD-RAM are unformatted. Format them before using them in this unit. Formatting also allows you to erase the entire contents of a disc.

Preparation

If the disc is dirty, clean it with the recommended cleaner (➔ page 53) before formatting.

- 4 Press [◀] to select “Yes” and press [ENTER].**
- 5 Press [◀] to select “Start” and press [ENTER].**
Formatting starts.
 - A message appears when formatting is finished.
- 6 Press [ENTER] to complete the procedure.**

To stop formatting

Press [RETURN].

- You can cancel formatting if it takes more than 2 minutes. The disc must be reformatted if you do this.

Note

- **Do not disconnect the AC power supply cord while the message “Formatting the disc” is on the television. This can render the disc unusable.**
- Formatting normally takes a few minutes, however it may take up to a maximum of 70 minutes.
- The contents on the disc are erased when you format it even if you have set program or disc protection.
- It may not be possible to use a disc on this unit if you cannot format it.
- Formatting cannot be performed on DVD-R or CD-R/RW.
- Formatting erases all contents on the disc, including computer data.

Finalize

DVD-R (DVD-R recorded on this unit only)

You can play DVD-R on compatible DVD players by finalizing them on this unit, effectively making them into DVD-Video that complies with DVD-Video standards.

- 4 Press [◀] to select “Yes” and press [ENTER].**
- 5 Press [◀] to select “Start” and press [ENTER].**
Finalizing starts.
 - A message appears when finalizing is finished.
- 6 Press [ENTER] to complete the procedure.**

Note

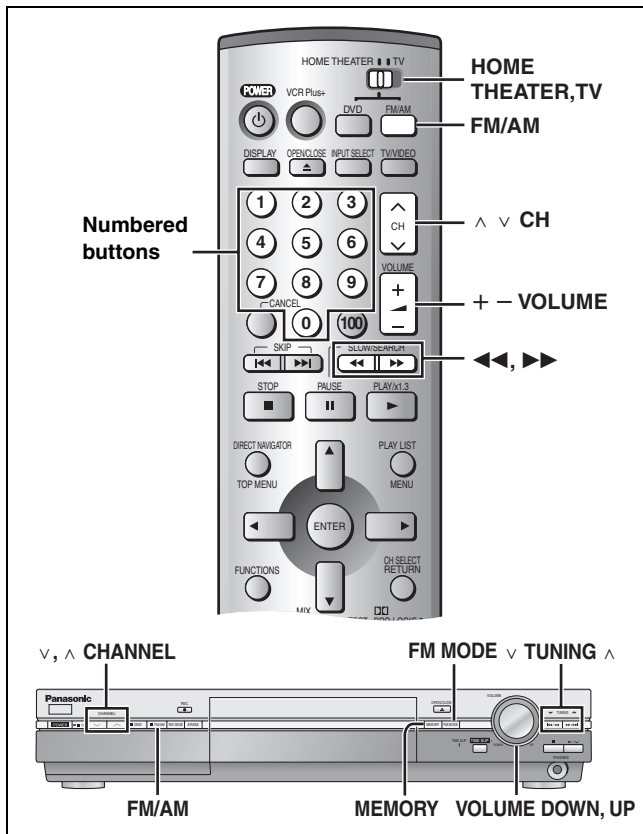
- **Do not disconnect the AC power supply cord while the message “Finalizing the disc” is on the television. This will render the disc unusable.**
- Finalizing takes up to 15 minutes.

After finalizing..

- You cannot record or perform editing such as giving titles and erasing programs.
 - Programs longer than 5 minutes are divided into about five-minute chapters.
 - There is a pause of several seconds between program segments.
 - These DVD-R can be played on other Panasonic DVD players, but this is not guaranteed. Play may not be possible due to the player you are using, the DVD-R, or the condition of the recording. Play the disc using this unit if you experience problems with other equipment.

- Preparation**
- Switch [HOME THEATER, TV] to "HOME THEATER".
 - Press [FM/AM] to select "FM" or "AM" as the source.

Manual tuning

- 1 Press [∇ TUNING] or [TUNING \wedge] to select the frequency of the required station.

Remote control: Press [\lll] or [\ggg].
 TUNED: Displayed when a radio station is tuned.
 ST: Displayed when a stereo FM broadcast is being received.

 Up to 12 stations can each be set in the FM and AM bands.

Automatic presetting

Main unit only

- 1 Tune to "FM 87.9" MHz or "FM 87.5" MHz (\Rightarrow left).

- 2 Press and hold [MEMORY].

Release the button when "AUTO" is displayed.

The tuner presets all the stations it can receive into the channels in ascending order.

"SET OK" is displayed when the stations are set. The last station to be set is then played.

- 3 Tune to "AM 520" kHz.

Repeat step 2 for AM automatic presetting.

"ERROR" is displayed

Presetting was unsuccessful. Preset manually.

Manual presetting

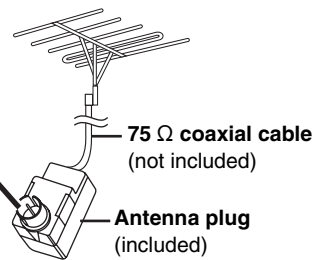
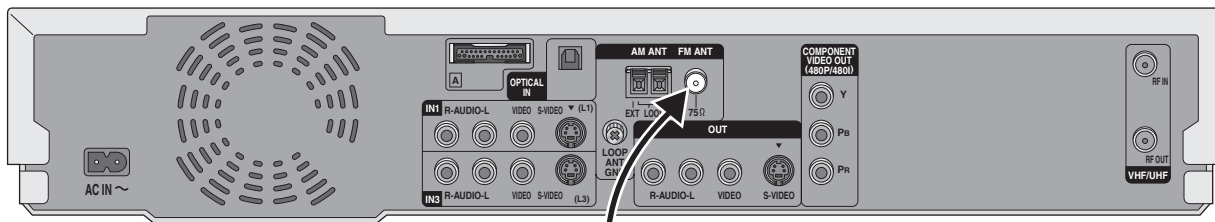

Optional FM antenna connection

Use FM outdoor antenna if radio reception is poor.

Note

- Disconnect the outdoor antenna when the unit is not in use.
- Do not use the outdoor antenna during an electrical storm.



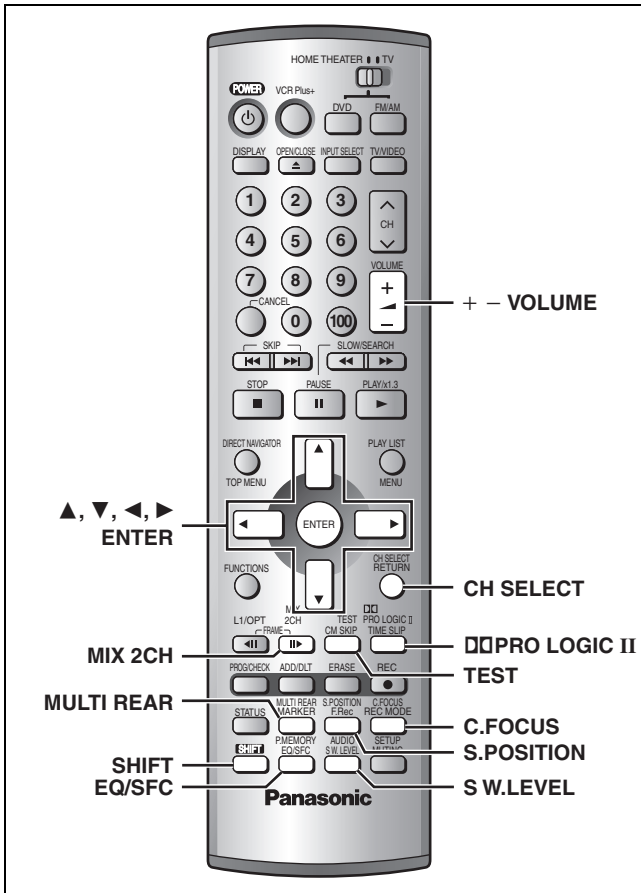
FM outdoor antenna (Using a television antenna)

- Disconnect the FM indoor antenna.
 - The antenna should be installed by a competent technician.
- Rework your outdoor antenna's 75 Ω coaxial cable as follows.

- ① **Remove a piece of the outer vinyl insulator.**

10 mm (13/32")
Peel back
7 mm (9/32")
- ② **Carefully pull the tabs apart to remove the cover.**
- ③ **Install the coaxial cable.**
Clamp the cable conductor, and wind it on so that it does not contact anything else.

Clamp with pliers
- ④ **Attach the cover.**



Dolby Digital and DTS

- Dolby Digital and DTS are digital encoding systems used on DVD to carry surround sound. Both were originally developed for use in cinemas.
- This unit automatically recognizes and decodes these systems.

Software encoded with Dolby Digital can be identified with this mark.



Software encoded with DTS can be identified with this mark.



Play a Dolby Digital or DTS source.

The Dolby Digital or DTS indicator lights.



To down-mix Dolby Digital or DTS (multiple-channel) signals to 2 channels

Press [SHIFT]+[MIX 2CH].



To cancel, press [SHIFT]+[MIX 2CH] again.

When "D.MIX" flashes on the display DVD-A

The DVD-Audio contains multiple-channel signals that cannot be down-mixed.

- When connected with headphones, the following sound field systems cannot be used. (Excluding Sound Field Control)
- You may experience a reduction in sound quality when these sound field systems are used with some sources. If this occurs, turn the sound field system off.

Dolby Pro Logic II

The Dolby Pro Logic II processor works not only on sources recorded with Dolby Surround, but also on any stereo source.

1 Press [SHIFT]+ [DOLBY PRO LOGIC II].

Each time you do this:
OFF → MOVIE → MUSIC → PANORAMA



- MOVIE:** Use this mode when playing movie software, especially videotapes, recorded in Dolby Surround.
- MUSIC:** Adds surround effects to stereo sources.
- PANORAMA:** Sound is spread out more so you feel like you are surrounded by music.

2 Play a Dolby Surround or stereo source.

To cancel
Select "Dolby PLII OFF".

Note
This does not work when playing multi-channel Dolby Digital.

Sound Field Control

Press [EQ/SFC] to select a setting.



Each time you press the button:

- FLAT:** Canceled (no effect is added) (factory preset).
- HEAVY:** Adds punch to rock.
- CLEAR:** Clarifies higher sounds.
- SOFT:** For background music.
- DISCO:** Reverberates sound to make you feel like you were in a disco.
- LIVE:** Makes vocals more alive.
- HALL:** Expands sound to make you feel like you were in a hall.

To check the current setting
Press [EQ/SFC].

Center Focus

You can make the sound of the center speaker seem like it is coming from within the television.

Press [SHIFT]+[C.FOCUS].

Each time you do this:
CENTER FOCUS ON → CENTER FOCUS OFF

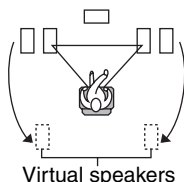


- This will have less effect when Dolby Pro Logic II is turned on.



Virtual Rear Surround

This mode is useful if you have to place your surround speakers near the front speakers due to the layout of your room. This mode makes it seem like the sound from the surround speakers is coming from behind you.



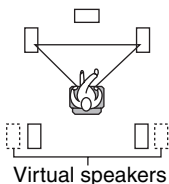
Press and hold **[SHIFT]+[MULTI REAR]** for more than 5 seconds.

Each time you do this:
V.R.S ON ↔ V.R.S OFF



Multi Rear Surround

This mode makes it seem like sound is coming from multiple rear surround speakers virtually when connected with surround speakers.



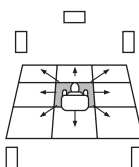
Press **[SHIFT]+[MULTI REAR]**.

Each time you do this:
M.R.S ON ↔ M.R.S OFF



Seat position

Using this function makes you feel like you are sitting in the ideal seating position (in the center of the circle formed by the speakers), even if you cannot due to the layout of your room.



1 Press **[SHIFT]+[S.POSITION]**.



2 While "SEAT POSITION" is displayed Press **[▲, ▼, ◀, ▶]** to select a position.



To cancel

Press **[SHIFT]+[S.POSITION]** again.

While virtual rear surround is on, the seat position is changed in three horizontal steps.

Adjusting the bass

Press **[S W.LEVEL]**.



Each time you press the button:
SUB W 1 → SUB W 2 → SUB W 3 → SUB W 4 (factory preset)

Speaker level adjustments

Adjust the level of the speakers so they are the same apparent level as the front speakers where you would normally be sitting and listening. (L, R → below, Balance)

- Dolby Pro Logic II: Press **[SHIFT]+[DOLBY PRO LOGIC II]**.

1 Press **[SHIFT]+[TEST]** to output a test signal.

2 Press **[VOLUME +]** or **[-]** to set the volume level normally used for listening.

3 Press **[▲]** (to increase) or **[▼]** (to decrease).

To stop the test signal, press **[SHIFT]+[TEST]** again.

■ To adjust speaker level during play

Balance

You can adjust the balance of the front speakers.

CPRM (Content Protection for Recordable Media)

CPRM is the copyright protection technology that is used to protect broadcasts that are allowed to be recorded only once (e.g. some CATV broadcasts).

Decoder

A decoder restores the coded audio signals on DVDs to normal.

Dolby Digital

This is a method of coding digital signals developed by Dolby Laboratories. Apart from stereo (2-channel) audio, these signals can also be multi-channel audio. A large amount of audio information can be recorded on one disc using this method.

This unit is set to record using Dolby Digital in all recording modes.

Dolby Pro Logic II

Dolby Pro Logic II is an advanced decoder that derives 5 channel surround (Left, Center, Right, Left and Right Surround) from any stereo program material, whether or not it has been specifically Dolby Surround encoded. Pro Logic II provides two full-range surround channels, as opposed to Pro Logic's single surround channel.

DTS (Digital Theater Systems)

This surround system is used in many movie theaters around the world. There is good separation between the channels, so realistic sound effects are possible.

Film and video

DVD-Videos are recorded using either film or video. Usually, film is recorded at 24 frames per second, the rate movies are filmed at, while video is recorded at 30 frames per second.

Frame still and field still

Frames are the still pictures that make moving pictures. About thirty are shown each second. A frame still may appear blurred but overall quality is high.

Two fields appear alternately to make up one frame. A field still is not blurred but picture quality is lower.

Interlace and progressive output

NTSC, the video signal standard, has 480 interlaced (I) scan lines, whereas progressive scanning uses twice the number of scan lines. This is called 480P.

I/P/B

MPEG 2, the video compression standard adopted for use with DVD-Video, codes frames using these 3 picture types.

I: Intra coded picture

This picture has the best quality and is the best to use when adjusting the picture.

P: Predictive coded picture

This picture is calculated based on past I- or P-pictures.

B: Bidirectionally-predictive coded picture

This picture is calculated by comparing past and future I- and P-pictures so it has the lowest volume of information.

Linear PCM (pulse code modulation)

These are uncompressed digital signals, similar to those found on CDs. LPCM sound is available when recording in XP mode.

Playback control (PBC)

If a Video CD has playback control, you can select scenes and information with menus.

Pan&Scan/Letterbox

In general, DVD-Video are produced with the intention that they be viewed on a widescreen television with an aspect ratio of 16:9. This means you can view most material with the intended aspect ratio on a widescreen television.

Material with this ratio will not fit onto a standard television with an aspect ratio of 4:3. Two styles of picture, "Pan&Scan" and "Letterbox", deal with this problem.

Pan&Scan: The sides are cut off so the picture fills the screen.

Letterbox: Black bands appear at the top and bottom of the picture so the picture itself appears in an aspect ratio of 16:9.

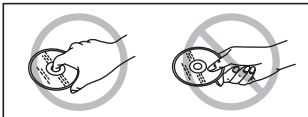

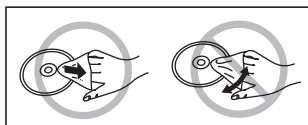

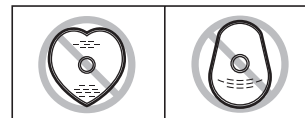
