Safety Instructions



- ◆ Do not expose the television to extreme temperature conditions or to extreme humidity conditions.

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






Becoming Familiar with the Remote Control



Buttons and markings are subject to change.

The remote control is used mainly to:

- ♦ Change channels and adjust the various settings
- ◆ Use the EPG (<u>E</u>lectronic <u>P</u>rogramme <u>G</u>uide)
- ◆ Set up the television using the on-screen menu system



The performance of the remote control may be affected by bright light.


Inserting the Batteries in the Remote Control




You must insert or replace the batteries in the remote control when you:

- ◆ Purchase the television
- Find that the remote control is no longer operating correctly
- 1 Remove the cover on the rear of the remote control by pressing the symbol downwards and then pulling firmly to remove it.
- Insert two R03, UM4, "AAA" 1.5V or equivalent batteries taking care to respect the polarities:
 - on the battery against on the remote control
 - ♦ + on the battery against + on the remote control
- 3 Replace the cover by aligning it with the base of the remote control and pressing it back into place.








Connecting to an Aerial or Cable Television Network





To view television channels correctly, a signal must be received by the set from one of the following sources:

- ♦ An outdoor aerial
- A cable television network
- A satellite network
- 1 In the first three cases, connect the aerial or network input cable to the 75 Ω coaxial socket on the rear of the television.
- 2 If you are using an indoor aerial, you may need to turn it when tuning your television until you obtain a picture that is both sharp and clear.

Switching Your Television On and Off



The mains lead is attached to the rear of your television.

- If you have purchased this television in the United Kingdom, refer to page 51 for further instructions on plug wiring.
- 1 Plug the mains lead into an appropriate socket.
 - The main voltage is indicated on the rear of the television and the frequency is 50 or 60Hz.
- 2 Press the "①" (On/Off) button on the front of the television.


Result: The Standby indicator on the front of the television lights up.


3 Press the **POWER** (小) button on the remote control to switch the television on.

Result: The programme that you were watching last is reselected automatically.

If you have not yet stored any channels, No clear picture appears. Refer to "Storing Channels Automatically" on page 26 or "Storing Channels Manually" on page 28.

4 To switch your television off, press the "⊕" (On/Off) button again.





Placing Your Television in Standby Mode

Your television can be placed in Standby mode, in order to reduce:


- ◆ Power consumption
- ♦ Wear of the cathode ray tube

The Standby mode can be useful when you wish to interrupt viewing temporarily (during a meal, for example).

1 Press the **POWER** ((b)) button on the remote control.

Result: The screen is turned off and the Standby indicator on the front of the television lights up in red.

2 To switch the television back on, simply press the **POWER** (也) button again.





Plug & Play Feature



Plug & Play














When the television is initially powered on, three basic customer settings proceed automatically and subsequently: setting the language, channel and clock.

1 If the television is in Standby mode, press the **POWER** (小) button on the remote control.

Result: The message Plug & Play is displayed. It flickers for a little while and then Language menu is automatically displayed.

Select the appropriate language by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button. Press the MENU button to enter the language.

Result: The message Ant. Input Check is displayed.

If any language is not selected on the Language menu, the Language menu will disappear about 30 seconds later.

3 Make sure that the antenna is connected to the TV. Press the ◀ or ▶ button.

Result: The Auto store menu is displayed with Country is selected.

Select your country by pressing the

or

button. To search the channels, select Search by pressing the

or

button, and then press the

or

button. Press the MENU button to stop the search.

Result: The **Time** menu is displayed with **Clock** is selected.

Refer to "Storing Channels Automatically" on page 26.

5 Press the ◀ or ▶ button to move to the hour or minute. Set the hour or minute by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button.

Refer to "Setting and Displaying the Current Time" on page 42.

6 When you have finished, press the **MENU** button.

Result: The menu is turned to **UPDATE CHANNEL LIST** in DTV mode automatically.

7 If you want to reset this feature...

The Setup and Channel menus are available in Analog TV mode.

Press the MENU button.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Setup, and then press the ENTER button.

Result: The Plug & Play is selected.

3 Press the ENTER button again.

Result: This feature starts with the message Plug & Play is displayed.

Viewing the Demonstration

To become familiar with the various menus provided by your television, you can view the inbuilt demonstration.

1 Press the **MENU** button.

Result: The main menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select **Setup**.

Result: The options available in the Setup group are

displayed.


3 Press the ENTER button.

4 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Demonstration.

5 Press the **ENTER** button.

Result: Each of the menu options is displayed in turn.

When you wish to exit from the demonstration, press the EXIT button on the remote control. If you press the MENU button, the demonstration is stopped immediately.





Choosing Your Language

When you start using your television for the first time, you must select the language which will be used for displaying menus and indications.

1 Press the **MENU** button.

Result: The main menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select **Setup**.

Result: The options available in the **Setup** group are


displayed.

3 Press the ENTER button.

4 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Language. Press the ENTER button

5 Select the appropriate language by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button repeatedly.

6 To exit displayed menu, press the **EXIT** button.







Previewing the DTV Menu System
















Available in the Digital TV mode.

Updating the Channel List

You can update the channel list when the broadcaster adds new services or if you move the TV to a new location.

1 Press the **D.MENU** button.

Result: The DTV menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Channel.

Result: The options available in the Channel group are

displayed.

3 Press the ENTER button.

Result: The Update Channel List is selected.

4 Press the ENTER button again to start the search.

Result: When it has finished, the number of scanned services will be displayed.

 The existing favourite channel list will not be deleted when the channel list is updated.

 To stop the scan before it has finished, press the ENTER button.

If the signal status is poor, the "No signal. Check the aerial connection" message is displayed.







Editing Your Favourite Channels















You can edit your favourite channels using the four colour buttons.

1 Press the **D.MENU** button.

Result: The DTV menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Channel.

Result: The options available in the **Channel** group are displayed.

3 Press the ENTER button.

4 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Edit Favourite Channels.

5 Press the ENTER button.

Result: The EDIT FAVOURITE CHANNELS menu is displayed.

♦ Add

1 Press the Red button in the Edit Favourite Channels menu.

Result: The **ADD FAVOURITES** menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the required channel.

3 Press the ENTER button.

Result: A "**" icon is shown next to the selected channel and the channel will be added to the favourite channel list.

➤ To undo, press the **ENTER** button again.

- To add all channels to the favourite channel list, press the Red button.
- ◆ To remove all channels, press the Green button.

Move

In the Edit Favourite Channels menu, select the required channel using the ▲ or ▼ button.

2 Press the Green button.

Result: A "♠" icon is displayed on the left side of the channel name.

3 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the channel that you want to move, and press the Green or ENTER button.

Result: The channel is moved to its new position.

Editing Your Favourite Channels (continued)

ENG

◆ Renumber

- In the Edit Favourite Channels menu, select the channel to be assigned a new number by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button.
- 2 Press the Yellow button.

Result: The channel number is highlighted.

- You can revert to the previous channel number pressing the Yellow button again, or Cancel.
- 3 Enter the new number using the numeric buttons (0~9). Press the **ENTER** button to confirm.

♦ Delete

- In the Edit Favourite Channels menu, select the channel to be deleted from the favourite channels list by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button.
- 2 Press the Blue button.

Result: The selected channel and number will be deleted.

To add a deleted channel back in to the favourite channel list, see 'Add' on page 14.









Selecting Channel Lists

You can determine the channel list that is initially shown when the EPG (GUIDE button), channel list (CH LIST button) or service information (INFO button) is selected.

- 1 Press the **D.MENU** button.
 - Result: The DTV menu is displayed.
- 2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select **Channel**.

Result: The options available in the **Channe1** group are displayed.

- 3 Press the ENTER button.
- 4 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select (highlight) Select Channel List. Press the ENTER button.
- 5 Select All or Favourites using the ▲ or ▼ button, and press the ENTER button.

Result:

The selected option is stored and the preset/default channel list in the EPG menu and channel list will be displayed.





Viewing EPG (Electronic Programme Guide) Information













You can display EPG information at any time while watching digital programmes.

The **EPG** (Electronic **P**rogramme **G**uide) information is provided by the broadcasters. Programme entries may appear blank or out of date as result of the information broadcast on a given channel. The display will dynamically update as soon as new information becomes available.

♦ Now & Next Guide

For the five channels indicated in the left-hand column, displays the *Current* programme and the *Next* programme information.

♦ Full Guide

Displays the programme information as time ordered 30 minute segments. One and half hours of programme information is displayed which may be scrolled forwards or backwards in time.

1 Press the **D.MENU** button.

Result: The options available in the **Guide** group are displayed.

- 2 Press the ENTER button.
- 3 Select the your required guide (Now & Next Guide or Full Guide) by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button.
- 4 Press the ENTER button.


Result: The selected guide menu is displayed.

You can also display the guide menu simply by pressing the **GUIDE** button. Press the **Red** button to toggle between the **Now & Next Guide** and the **Full Guide**.



- ◆ Information such as the channel number, programme title and running time, status bar, and brief summary of the highlighted programme will be displayed in the top right corner of the screen. If there is a lengthy summary, "..." will be displayed. Press the **INFO** button for the full summary text.
- ◆ Five channels are displayed. To scroll between channels, move to a channel using the ▲ or ▼ button. To display page by page, use the P or P v button.



Viewing All Channels and Favourite Channels















In the EPG menu, you can display all channels or favourite channels.

1 Press the **D.MENU** button.

Result: The options available in the **Guide** group are displayed.

2 Press the ENTER button.

3 Select the your required guide (Now & Next Guide or Full Guide) by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button.

4 Press the ENTER button.

Result: The selected guide menu is displayed.

5 Press the Green button.

Result: The "♠" icon for all channels and the "★" icon for favourite channels is displayed in the top right corner

of the screen.

To toggle between the all and favourite channels list, press the **Green** button again.

Select a programme of your choice by pressing the ▲, ▼, ◄, or ▶ button.

7 Press the INFO button to display information about the highlighted programme.

Result: Available programme information is displayed.

8 When the favourite channel list has not been set up:

"The favourites list is empty. Would you like to choose your favourites now?" message is displayed.

◆ Select "Yes".

Result: The Edit Favourite Channels menu is displayed. If you select "No", all channels will

remain unchanged.

 To edit the favourite channels, refer to page 14~15 for more details.

- ◆ A11 Channels is the list of channels that have been scanned by the channel list update. All channels are displayed in the all channel mode.
 - ◆ Favourites (favourite channels) is the list of channels that has been set in the Edit Favourite Channels menu (refer to page 14~15).

Viewing Channel Lists

ENG

You can display a list of all channels or your favourite channels.

1 Press the CH LIST button.

Result: The channel list is displayed.

- 2 Move to the channel of your choice by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button.
- - Your favourite channels are only displayed if they were previously set in the Edit Favourite Channels menu (refer to page 14~15).
- 4 To tune to the selected channel, press the ENTER button while the cursor is on the selected channel.
 - The channel number, name and an icon are displayed in the top left corner while changing the channel. The channel number and name are displayed if the channel is one of the all channels, and a "★" icon if the channel is one of the favourite channels.
- 5 To exit from the channel list, press the **EXIT** button.







Displaying Programme Information

While viewing a channel, additional information about the current programme may be displayed.

1 While viewing a programme, press the **INFO** button.

Result: The programme information is displayed.

- To display programme information about other channels, press the ▲ or ▼ button.
- 3 Press the ENTER button to switch over to the channel for which information is displayed.
 - When Favourites is displayed in the top right corner, only those channels in the favourite list are displayed. When All Channels is displayed in the top right corner, all channels known may be displayed.
- 4 To exit from banner information, press the **EXIT** button.





Selecting Category Colours









You can change the colours for Categories.

1 Press the **D.MENU** button.

Result: The options available in the **Guide** group are displayed.

2 Press the ENTER button.

3 Select the your required guide (Now & Next Guide or Full Guide) by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button.

4 Press the **ENTER** button.

Result: The selected guide menu is displayed.

5 Press the Yellow button.

Result: A pop up screen that enables you to select category colours is displayed.

6 Select a category by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button.

7 Press the **ENTER** button.

Result: The selectable colours are displayed on the right side

of the screen.

8 Select a colour by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button.

Result: The colour selected for a category is stored and the

colours for the programme slots of the EPG will

change to that selection.

9 Press the **ENTER** button to change the setting.

Using the Preferences

ENG

You can use various settings to suit your personal preferences.

- **♦** Activating/deactivating the Subtitle
- ◆ Adjusting the Translucency Level
- ◆ Activating/deactivating the Digital Text
- 1 Press the **D.MENU** button.

Result: The DTV menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select **Preference**.

Result: The options available in the **Preference** group are displayed.

- 3 Press the ENTER button.
- Select your required menu (Subtitle, Translucency Level, or Digital Text) by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button, and press the ENTER button.

Result: The options of the selected menu available are displayed.

- 5 Select the required option by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button, and press the ENTER button to change the setting.
 - ◆ Subtitle : On or Off
 - Translucency Level: High, Medium, Low or Off
 Controls the amount of the TV picture that is visible through
 the menu.
 - Digital Text: Disabled or Enabled
 If the programme is broadcast with digital text, this feature is enabled.









Selecting the Preferred Language (Subtitle or Audio)







You can change the default value for subtitle and audio languages.

1 Press the **D.MENU** button.

Result: The DTV menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select **Feature**.

3 Press the ENTER button.

Select your required menu (Preferred Subtitle Language or Preferred Audio Language) by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button, and press the ENTER button.

Result: The options of the selected menu available are displayed.

5 Select the required option (English, Welsh, or Gaelic) by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button, and press the ENTER button to change the setting.

English is the default in cases where the selected language is unavailable in the broadcast.

Viewing Product Information

You can view your product information. For service or repair please contact a Samsung approved dealer.

1 Press the **D.MENU** button.

Result: The DTV menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select System.

Result: The options available in the System group are

displayed.

3 Press the ENTER button.

Result: The **Product Information** menu is selected.

4 Press the ENTER button again.

Result: The product information is displayed as below.

Checking the Signal Information

You can get information about the signal status.

1 Press the **D.MENU** button.

Result: The DTV menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select System.

Result: The options available in the **System** group are

displayed.

3 Press the ENTER button.

4 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Signal Information, and press the ENTER button.

Result: The signal information is displayed.

If the signal status is poor, the "No signal. Check the aerial connection" message is displayed.







Upgrading the Software (Option)















To keep your product up-to-date with new Digital Television features then software upgrades are periodically broadcast as part of the normal Television signal. It will automatically detect these signals and display the software upgrade banner. You are given the option to install the upgrade.

♦ Upgrade Now

If you select **Upgrade Now**, the **iDTV** immediately installs the new upgrade and then restarts.

Upgrade Later

If you select **Upgrade Later**, the upgrade is postponed until the next restart or channel change some 90 minutes later, when the upgrade dialogue appears again.

♦ Don't Upgrade

If you select **Don't Upgrade**, the **iDTV** does not perform the upgrade and the software upgrade banner is not displayed again. The upgrade is still stored internally, to subsequently upgrade to the new version then the following sequence of steps are performed.

1 Press the **D.MENU** button.

Result: The DTV menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select System.

Result: The options available in the **System** group are displayed.

3 Press the ENTER button.

4 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Software Upgrade, and press the ENTER button.

Result: The software upgrade information is displayed.

To switch to an alternative version, press the Red button. Press the Blue button to reset, activate the upgrade and restart.

Resetting



You can reset the values stored to the factory default values.

The Reset operation deletes all channel information and user preferences returning all values to their default factory state.

1 Press the **D.MENU** button.

Result: The DTV menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select System.

 $\underline{\textbf{Result}} : \qquad \textbf{The options available in the $\tt System} \ group \ are$

displayed.

3 Press the ENTER button.


Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Reset, and press the ENTER button.

Result: The warning message is displayed.

5 All values will be reset by pressing the coloured buttons (Red, Green, Yellow and Blue) in turn.








Storing Channels Automatically













Available in Analog TV mode.

You can scan for the frequency ranges available to you (and availability depends on your country). Automatically allocated programme numbers may not correspond to actual or desired programme numbers. However you can sort numbers manually and clear any channels you do not wish to watch.

1 Press the **MENU** button.

Result: The main menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Channel.

Result: The options available in the **Channel** group are displayed.

3 Press the ENTER button.

Result: The **Auto store** is selected.

4 Press the **ENTER** button again.

Result: The options available in the Auto store group are displayed with Country is selected.

5 Select your country by pressing the ◀ or ▶ button. The countries are displayed in the following order: UK - East Europe - Others - Belgie - Deutschland - España - France - Italia - Nederland - Schweiz - Sverige.

6 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select **Search**.

7 Press the ◀ or ▶ button to start the search.

Result: The horizontal bar is displayed, and then channels are stored in an order which reflects their positions in the frequency range. Finally, the search will end automatically.

To stop the search before it has finished, press the **MENU** button.

- When searching and storing are complete, the **sort** menu is displayed.
 - To sort the stored channels into the desired numerical order, go to Step 6 of the "Sorting the Stored Channels" procedure on page 27.
 - To exit from the channel store function without sorting the channels, press the MENU button repeatedly until the menus disappear.
- **9** When the channels have been stored, you can:
 - ◆ Sort them in the order required (refer to page 27)
 - ◆ Clear a channel (refer to page 30)
 - ◆ Assign a name to the stored channels (refer to page 31)
 - Fine tune channel reception if necessary (refer to page 32)
 - Activate the Digital Noise Reduction feature (refer to page 35)

Sorting the Stored Channels

This operation allows you to change the programme numbers of stored channels. This operation may be necessary after using auto store. You can delete the channels you do not want to keep.

1 Press the **MENU** button.

Result: The main menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Channel.

displayed.

3 Press the ENTER button.

4 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Sort.

5 Press the ENTER button.

6 Select the channel number that you wish to change by pressing the ◀ or ▶ button repeatedly.


You can also select the channel number directly by pressing the numeric buttons (0~9).

8 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select **Store**. Select **OK** to confirm the exchange of channel numbers by pressing the ◀ or ▶ button.

Result: The selected channel is exchanged with the one previously stored to the chosen number.

9 For all the channels to move to the required channel numbers, repeat steps 6 to 8 after selecting the From by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button.














Storing Channels Manually











Available in Analog TV mode.

You can store the television channels, including those received via cable networks.

When storing channels manually, you can choose:

- ♦ Whether or not to store each of the channels found
- The programme number of each stored channel which you wish to identify
- 1 Press the MENU button.

Result: The main menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Channel.

Result: The options available in the **Channel** group are displayed.

- 4 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Manual store.
- 5 Press the ENTER button.

Result: The options available in the Manual store group are displayed with Prog.No. is selected.

- To assign a programme number to a channel, press the ◀ or ► button
- 7 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Colour system. Indicate the broadcasting standard required by pressing the ◄ or ▶ button repeatedly.

Result: The colour standards are displayed in the following

order:

Auto - PAL - SECAM - NT4.43.

Automatic Degaussing to Remove Colour Patches



A degaussing coil is mounted around the picture tube, so you do not normally need to degauss the television manually.

If you move the television to a different position and color patches appear on the screen, you must:

- ◆ Unplug the television from the wall socket
- ◆ Leave the television power-off for about 30 minutes so that the automatic degauss function can be activated, and then press the "POWER" ((¹)) button on the remote control.
