## 1: Checking the accessories

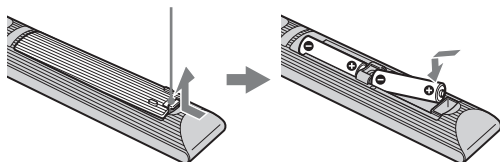

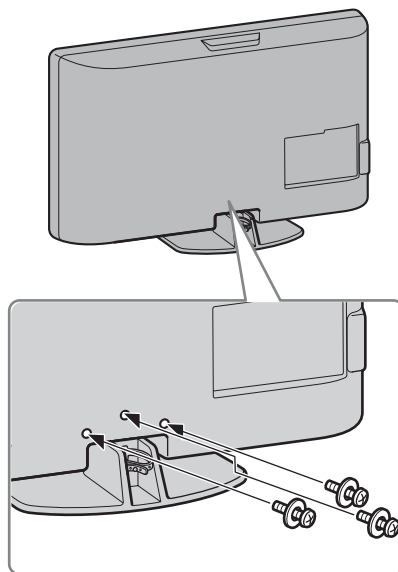
### To insert batteries into the remote


Push and lift the cover to open.



- Observe the correct polarity when inserting batteries.
- Do not use different types of batteries together or mix old and new batteries.
- Dispose of batteries in an environmentally friendly way. Certain regions may regulate the disposal of batteries. Please consult your local authority.
- Handle the remote with care. Do not drop or step on it, or spill liquid of any kind onto it.
- Do not place the remote in a location near a heat source, a place subject to direct sunlight, or a damp room.

## 2: Attaching the stand (except for KDL-20S4000)



- 1 Place the TV onto the stand by aligning the screw hole alignment lines over the stand as shown.
- 2 Fix the TV to the stand according to the arrow marks  that guide the screw holes using the supplied screws.

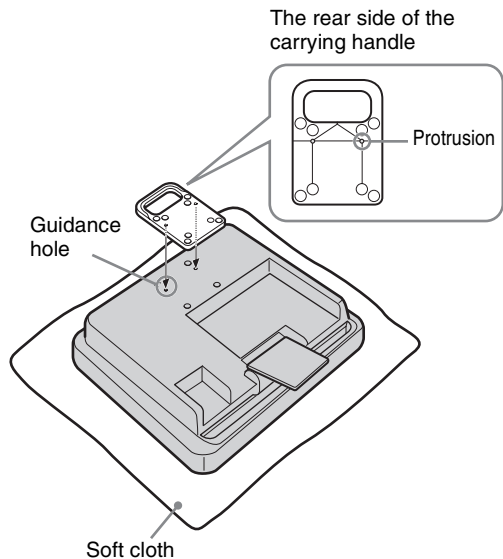


- This TV is very heavy, so two or more people should place the TV on the stand.
- If using an electric screwdriver, set the tightening torque at approximately 1.5N·m (15kgf·cm).
- When installing the TV onto the wall, follow step 1 to prevent the TV panel from falling over.

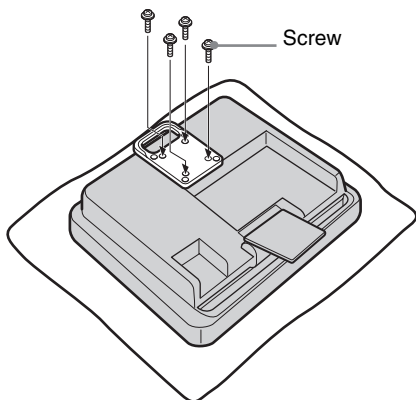
## 3: Attaching the carrying handle (for KDL-20S4000)

- 1 Place the TV with its screen facing down on a stable cloth-covered work surface.

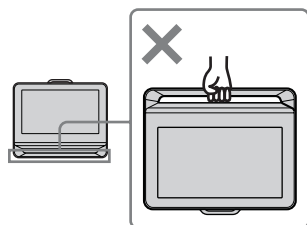
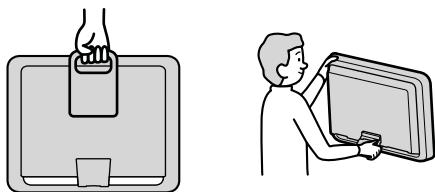
- Place the carrying handle onto the TV as shown.



- Attach the carrying handle to the TV using the four supplied screws.

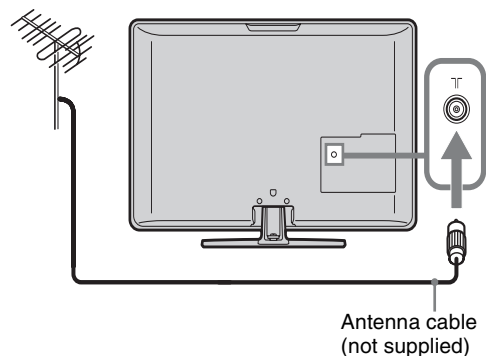


- When transporting the KDL-20S4000 by hand, hold it as shown.

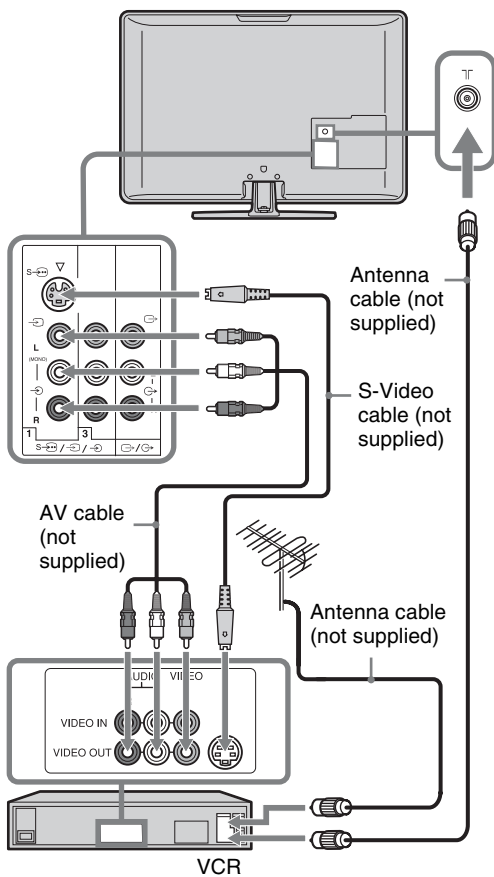

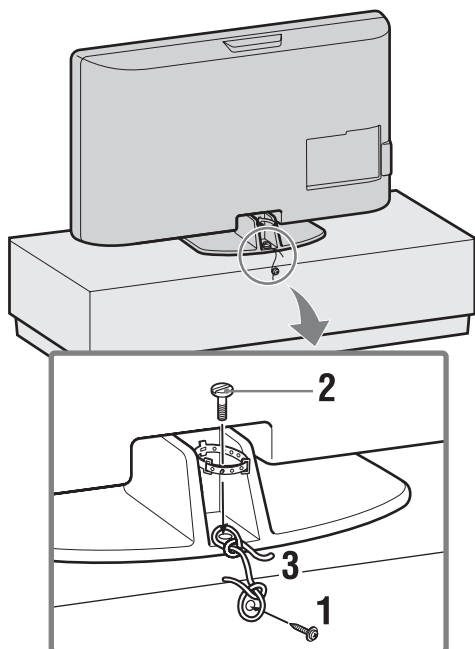

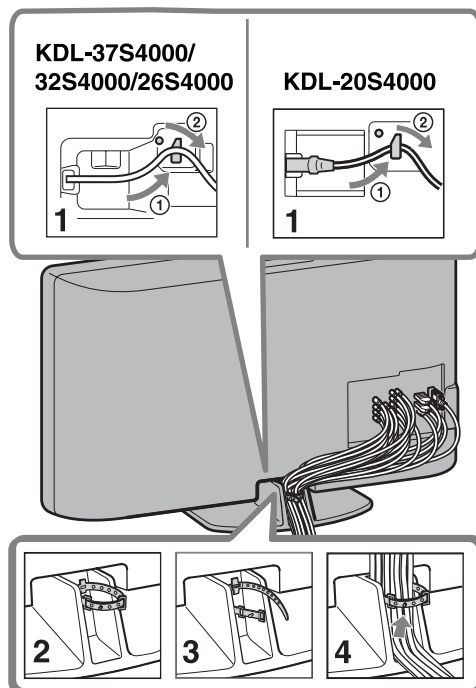
- When connecting an antenna cable (not supplied), an adaptor (not supplied) may be required.

## 5: Preventing the TV from toppling over

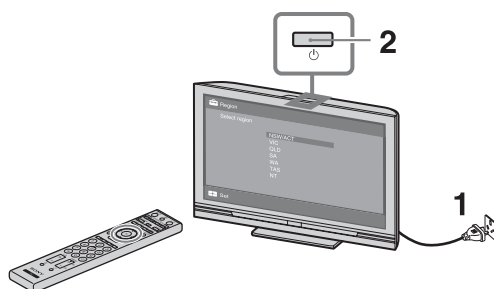


- 1 Install a wood screw (4 mm in diameter, not supplied) in the TV stand.
- 2 Install a machine screw (M5 × 12, not supplied) into the screw hole of the TV.
- 3 Tie the wood screw and the machine screw with a strong cord (not supplied).

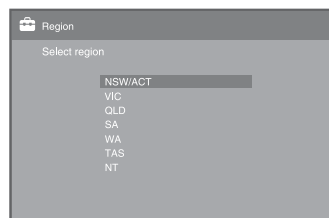

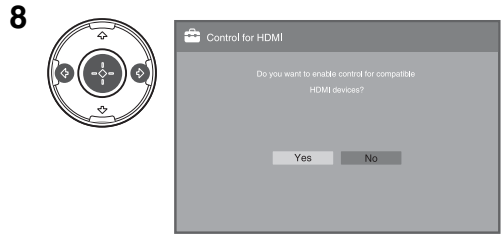
Select “Yes” to enable the system update (page 34).



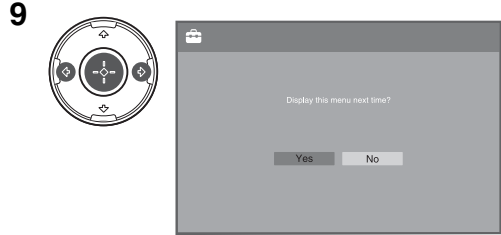
Make sure that the antenna is connected. The TV starts searching for all available digital channels, followed by all available analogue channels. This may take some time, so do not press any buttons on the TV or remote while proceeding.



If you want to change the order of analogue channels, follow the steps in “Programme Sorting” on page 32. If your TV cannot receive digital broadcasts, the “Clock Set” menu appears on the screen (page 29).



When using the control for HDMI function, select “Yes” to enable control for compatible HDMI devices.

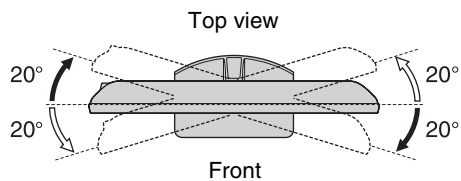

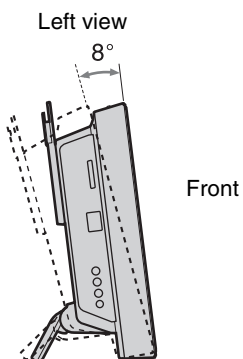

### Adjust the angle back and forth (tilt) (KDL-20S4000)

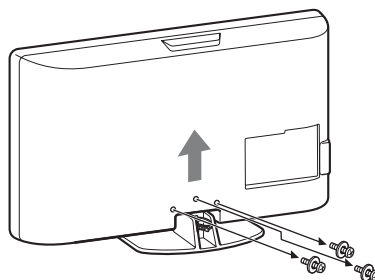


## Detaching the Table-Top Stand from the TV

# Safety Information

## Installation/Set-up

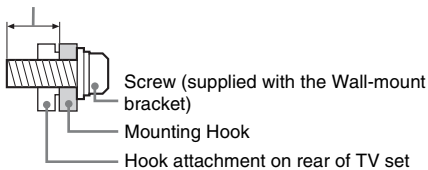
Install and use the TV set in accordance with the instructions below in order to avoid any risk of fire, electrical shock or damage and/or injuries.

### Installation

- The TV set should be installed near an easily accessible AC power outlet.
- Place the TV set on a stable, level surface to avoid it from falling down and cause personal injury or damage to the TV.
- Only qualified service personnel should carry out wall installations.
- For safety reasons, it is strongly recommended that you use Sony accessories, including:
  - KDL-37S4000/32S4000:
    - Wall-mount bracket SU-WL500
    - Wall-mount bracket SU-WL50B
    - TV stand SU-FL300M
  - KDL-26S4000:
    - Wall-mount bracket SU-WL100
- Be sure to use the screws supplied with the Wall-mount bracket when attaching the mounting hooks to the TV set. The supplied screws are designed so that they are 8 mm to 12 mm in length when measured from the attaching surface of the mounting hook.

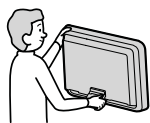
The diameter and length of the screws differ depending on the Wall-mount bracket model.  
Use of screws other than those supplied may result in internal damage to the TV set or cause it to fall, etc.

### Transporting

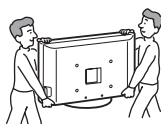
- Before transporting the TV set, disconnect all cables.
- Two or more people are needed to transport a large TV set.
- When transporting the TV set by hand, hold it as shown on the right. Do not put stress on the LCD panel.
- When lifting or moving the TV set, hold it firmly from the bottom.
- When transporting the TV set, do not subject it to jolts or excessive vibration.
- When transporting the TV set for repairs or when moving, pack it using the original carton and packing material.

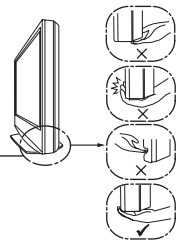

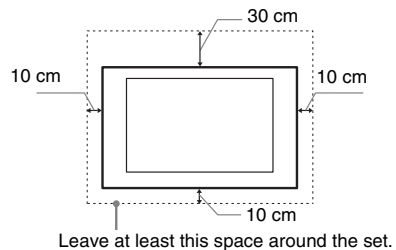
Be sure to hold the bottom of the panel, not the front part. Do not handle with dent area. Do not handle with the transparent bottom part.



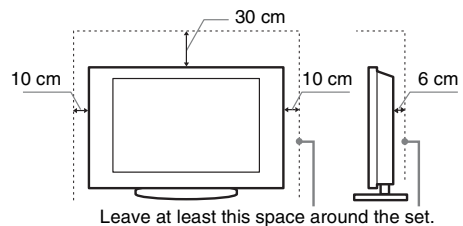
### Ventilation

- Never cover the ventilation holes or insert anything in the cabinet.
- Leave space around the TV set as shown below.
- It is strongly recommended that you use a Sony wall-mount bracket in order to provide adequate air-circulation.

#### Installed on the wall

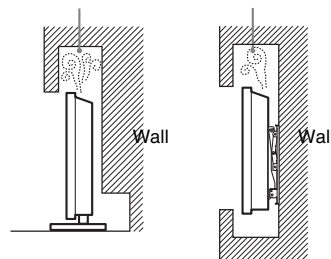


#### Installed with stand



- To ensure proper ventilation and prevent the collection of dirt or dust:
  - Do not lay the TV set flat, install upside down, backwards, or sideways.
  - Do not place the TV set on a shelf, rug, bed or in a closet.
  - Do not cover the TV set with a cloth, such as curtains, or items such as newspapers, etc.
  - Do not install the TV set as shown below.

Air circulation is blocked.



## AC power cord

Handle the AC power cord and outlet as follows in order to avoid any risk of fire, electrical shock or damage and/or injuries:

- Use only Sony supplied AC power cords, not those of other brands.
- Insert the plug fully into the AC power outlet.
- Operate the TV set on a 220–240 V AC supply only.
- When wiring cables, be sure to unplug the AC power cord for your safety and take care not to catch your feet on the cables.
- Disconnect the AC power cord from the AC power outlet before working on or moving the TV set.
- Keep the AC power cord away from heat sources.
- Unplug the AC power plug and clean it regularly. If the plug is covered with dust and it picks up moisture, its insulation may deteriorate, which could result in a fire.

### Notes

- Do not use the supplied AC power cord on any other equipment.
- Do not pinch, bend, or twist the AC power cord excessively. The core conductors may be exposed or broken.
- Do not modify the AC power cord.
- Do not put anything heavy on the AC power cord.
- Do not pull on the AC power cord itself when disconnecting the AC power cord.
- Do not connect too many appliances to the same AC power outlet.
- Do not use a poor fitting AC power outlet.

## Prohibited Usage

Do not install/use the TV set in locations, environments or situations such as those listed below, or the TV set may malfunction and cause a fire, electrical shock, damage and/or injuries.

### Location:

Outdoors (in direct sunlight), at the seashore, on a ship or other vessel, inside a vehicle, in medical institutions, unstable locations, near water, rain, moisture or smoke.

### Environment:

Places that are hot, humid, or excessively dusty; where insects may enter; where it might be exposed to mechanical vibration, near flammable objects (candles, etc). The TV shall not be exposed to dripping or splashing and no objects filled with liquids, such as vases, shall be placed on the TV.

### Situation:

Do not use when your hands are wet, with the cabinet removed, or with attachments not recommended by the manufacturer.

Disconnect the TV set from AC power outlet and antenna during lightning storms.

## Broken pieces:

- Do not throw anything at the TV set. The screen glass may break by the impact and cause serious injury.
- If the surface of the TV set cracks, do not touch it until you have unplugged the AC power cord. Otherwise electric shock may result.

## When not in use

- If you will not be using the TV set for several days, the TV set should be disconnected from the AC power for environmental and safety reasons.
- As the TV set is not disconnected from the AC power when the TV set is just turned off, pull the plug from the AC power outlet to disconnect the TV set completely.
- However, some TV sets may have features that require the TV set to be left in standby to work correctly.

## For children

- Do not allow children to climb on the TV set.
- Keep small accessories out of the reach of children, so that they are not mistakenly swallowed.

## If the following problems occur...

**Turn off** the TV set and unplug the AC power cord immediately if any of the following problems occur.

Ask your dealer or Sony service centre to have it checked by qualified service personnel.

### When:

- AC power cord is damaged.
- Poor fitting of AC power outlet.
- TV set is damaged by being dropped, hit or having something thrown at it.
- Any liquid or solid object falls through openings in the cabinet.

# Precautions

## Viewing the TV

- View the TV in moderate light, as viewing the TV in poor light or during long period of time, strains your eyes.
- When using headphones, adjust the volume so as to avoid excessive levels, as hearing damage may result.

## LCD Screen

- Although the LCD screen is made with high-precision technology and 99.99% or more of the pixels are effective, black dots may appear or bright points of light (red, blue, or green) may appear constantly on the LCD screen. This is a structural property of the LCD screen and is not a malfunction.
- Do not push or scratch the front filter, or place objects on top of this TV set. The image may be uneven or the LCD screen may be damaged.
- If this TV set is used in a cold place, a smear may occur in the picture or the picture may become dark. This does not indicate a failure. These phenomena disappear as the temperature rises.
- Ghosting may occur when still pictures are displayed continuously. It may disappear after a few moments.
- The screen and cabinet get warm when this TV set is in use. This is not a malfunction.
- The LCD screen contains a small amount of liquid crystal. Mercury is sometimes contained depending on the kind of fluorescent tubes. Follow your local ordinances and regulations for disposal.

## Handling and cleaning the screen surface/ cabinet of the TV set

Be sure to unplug the AC power cord connected to the TV set from AC power outlet before cleaning.

To avoid material degradation or screen coating degradation, observe the following precautions.

- To remove dust from the screen surface/cabinet, wipe gently with a soft cloth. If dust is persistent, wipe with a soft cloth slightly moistened with a diluted mild detergent solution.
- Never use any type of abrasive pad, alkaline/acid cleaner, scouring powder, or volatile solvent, such as alcohol, benzene, thinner or insecticide. Using such materials or maintaining prolonged contact with rubber or vinyl materials may result in damage to the screen surface and cabinet material.
- When adjusting the angle of the TV set, move it slowly so as to prevent the TV set from moving or slipping off from its table stand.

## Optional Equipment

Keep optional components or any equipment emitting electromagnetic radiation away from the TV set. Otherwise picture distortion and/or noisy sound may occur.

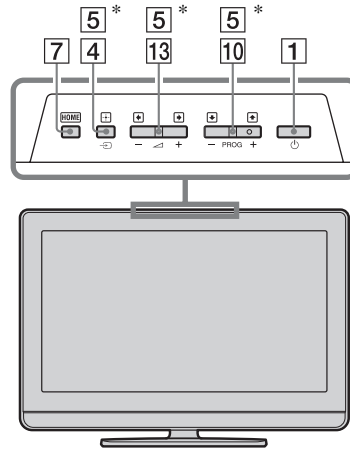

## Remote control and TV controls






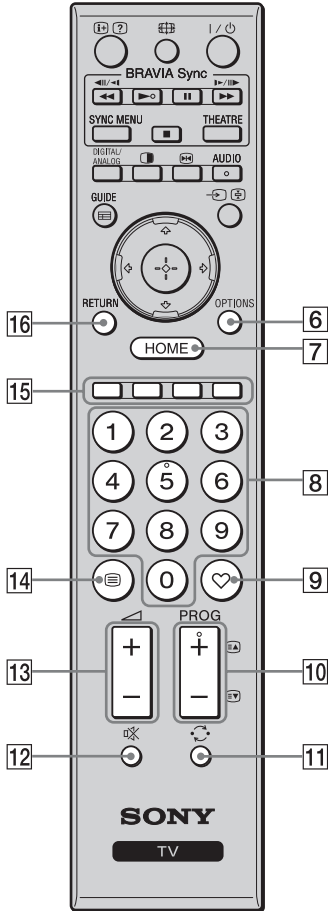
Buttons on the TV will work the same as those on the remote control.











\*In TV menu, these buttons will work as  $\uparrow/\downarrow/\leftarrow/\rightarrow/\oplus$ .



- The number **5**, **▶**, **PROG +** and **AUDIO** buttons have a tactile dot. Use the tactile dots as a reference when operating the TV.

Button	Description
<b>1</b> I/Power — TV standby	Press to turn the TV on or to switch to standby mode.  • To disconnect the TV completely, turn off the TV, then unplug the AC power cord from the AC power.
<b>2</b>  — <b>Picture freeze</b>	Press to freeze the TV picture. The frozen picture is displayed in full size, and a moving picture is displayed in the small screen. To remove the small screen, press once. To return to single picture mode, press again.  • This function is not available for a PC input source.
<b>3</b> <b>AUDIO</b>	In analogue mode: Press to change the dual sound mode (page 27). In digital mode: Press to change the language to be used for the programme currently being viewed (page 33).
<b>4</b> $\leftarrow/\rightarrow/\oplus$ — <b>Input select/Text hold</b>	In TV mode: Press to display a list of equipment connected to the TV (page 21). In Text mode: Press to hold the current page.
<b>5</b> $\uparrow/\downarrow/\leftarrow/\rightarrow/\oplus$	Press $\uparrow/\downarrow/\leftarrow/\rightarrow$ to move the on-screen cursor. Press $\oplus$ to select/confirm the highlighted item.

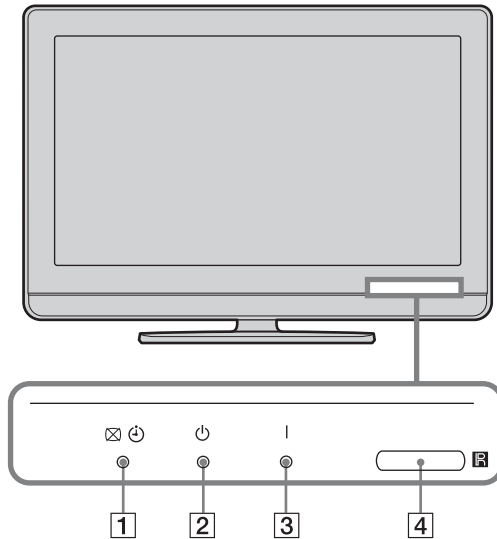






<b>6</b> <b>OPTIONS</b>	Press to display a list that contains “Twin Picture” (page 22), “PIP” (page 22), “Device Control”, or shortcuts to some setting menus (page 26). Use the “Device Control” menu to operate equipment that is compatible with control for HDMI. The listed options vary depending on the input source.
<b>7</b> <b>HOME</b>	Press to display the TV Home menu (page 25).
<b>8</b> <b>Number buttons</b>	In TV mode: Press to select channels. For channel numbers 10 and above, press the next digit quickly. In Text mode: Press to enter a page number.
<b>9</b>  <b>— Favourite</b>	Press to display the Digital Favourite List that you have specified (page 19).
<b>10</b> <b>PROG +/-</b>  	In TV mode: Press to select the next (+) or previous (–) channel. In Text mode: Press to select the next (  ) or previous (  ) page.
<b>11</b> 	Press to return to the channel that was last viewed (for more than five seconds).
<b>12</b>  <b>— Mute</b>	Press to mute the sound. Press again to restore the sound.  • In standby mode, if you want to turn on the TV without sound, press this button.
<b>13</b>  <b>+/-</b> <b>— Volume</b>	Press to adjust the volume.
<b>14</b>  <b>— Text</b>	Press to display text information (page 16).
<b>15</b> <b>Coloured buttons</b>	When the coloured buttons are available, an operation guide appears on the screen. Follow the operation guide to perform a selected operation (page 16, 18, 19).
<b>16</b> <b>RETURN</b>	Press to return to the previous screen of the displayed menu.



17	<b>GUIDE /</b> — EPG	Press to display the Digital Electronic Programme Guide (EPG) (page 18).
18	<b>DIGITAL/ANALOG</b>	Switches between digital and analogue modes.
19	<b>Twin Picture/PIP</b>	Displays two pictures simultaneously (page 22).
20	<b>+/?</b> — Info/Text reveal	In digital mode: Displays details of the programme currently being viewed. In analogue mode: Displays information. Press once to display the current channel number and screen mode. Press again to display clock information. Press a third time to remove the display from the screen. In Text mode (page 16): Reveals hidden information (e.g. answers to a quiz).
21		Press to change the Wide Mode (page 17).
22	<b>BRAVIA Sync</b>	: You can operate the BRAVIA Sync-compatible equipment that is connected to the TV. <b>SYNC MENU:</b> Displays the menu of connected HDMI equipment. While viewing other input screens or TV programmes, “HDMI Device Selection” is displayed when the button is pressed. <b>THEATRE:</b> You can set Theatre Mode on or off. When Theatre Mode is set to on, the optimum audio output (if the TV is connected with an audio system using an HDMI cable) and picture quality for film-based contents are automatically set.  • If you turn the TV off, Theatre Mode is also turned off.  • Control for HDMI (BRAVIA Sync) is only available with the connected Sony equipment that has the BRAVIA Sync logo or is compatible with control for HDMI.

## Indicators

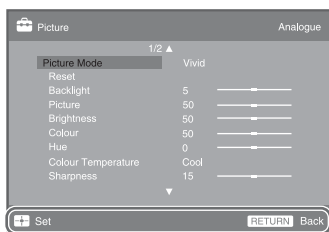


Indicator	Description
1   — <b>Picture Off / Timer</b>	Lights up in green when you select “Picture Off” (page 28). Lights up in orange when you set the timer (page 28).
2  — <b>Standby</b>	Lights up in red when the TV is in standby mode.
3  — <b>Power</b>	Lights up in green when the TV is on. Flashes while the remote is being operated.
4 <b>Remote control sensor/Light sensor</b>	Receives IR signals from the remote. Do not put anything over the sensor. The sensor may not operate properly.






- Make sure that the TV is completely turned off before unplugging the AC power cord. Unplugging the AC power cord while the TV is turned on may cause the indicator to remain lit or may cause the TV to malfunction.

## About the operation guide on the TV screen



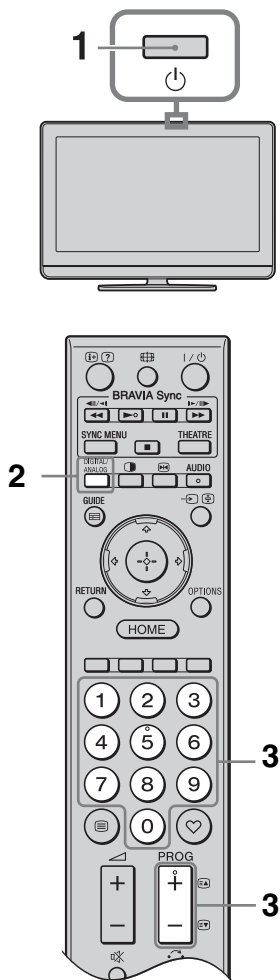
### Operation Guide

The operation guide provides help on how to operate the TV using the remote, and is displayed at the bottom of the screen. Use the remote buttons shown on the operation guide.

# Watching TV

## Watching TV



- 1 Press on the TV to turn on the TV.  
When the TV is in standby mode (the (standby) indicator on the TV front panel is red), press on the remote to turn on the TV.
- 2 Press **DIGITAL/ANALOG** to switch between digital and analogue modes.  
The available channels vary depending on the mode.

- 3 Press the number buttons or **PROG +/-** to select a TV channel.

To select channel numbers 10 and above using the number buttons, enter the next digit quickly.

To select a digital programme using the Digital Electronic Programme Guide (EPG), see page 18.

In digital mode, an information banner appears briefly. Each time you press /, the banner changes cyclically as follows:

Current programme information → Next programme information → No banner

The following icons may be indicated on the banner.

- : Radio service
- : Scrambled/Subscription service
- : Subtitles available
- : Subtitles available for the hearing impaired
- : Multiple audio languages available
- : Parental Lock
- : Parental rating

### To access Text

Press . Each time you press , the display changes cyclically as follows:

Text → Text over the TV picture (mix mode)  
→ No Text (exit the Text service)

To select a page, press the number buttons or /.

To hold a page, press /.

To reveal hidden information, press /.



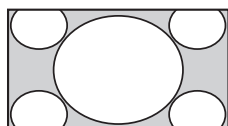
- When four coloured items appear at the bottom of the Text page, you can access pages quickly and easily (Fast Text). Press the corresponding coloured button to access the page.



## To change the Wide Mode manually

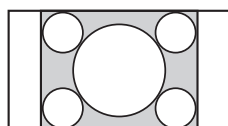
Press **⏏** repeatedly to select the desired Wide Mode.

### Wide Zoom\*



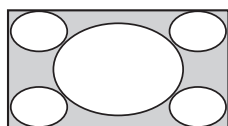
Enlarges the centre portion of the picture. The left and right edges of the picture are stretched to fill the 16:9 screen.

### Normal



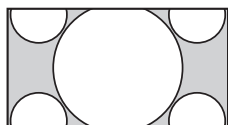
Displays the 4:3 picture in its original size. Side bars are shown to fill the 16:9 screen.

### Full



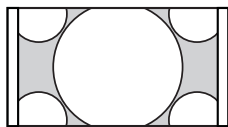
Stretches the 4:3 picture horizontally, to fill the 16:9 screen.

### Zoom\*



Displays the cinemascopic (letter box format) picture in the correct proportion.

### 14:9\*



Displays the 14:9 picture in the correct proportion. As a result, side bars are shown on the screen.

\* Parts of the top and bottom of the picture may be cut off. You can adjust the vertical position of the picture. Press **⏏** to move the picture up or down (e.g. to read subtitles).



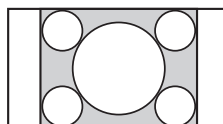
- When you select “Wide Zoom”, some characters and/or letters at the top and the bottom of the picture may not be visible. In such a case, adjust “Vertical Size” in the “Screen Settings” menu (page 29).



- When “Auto Wide” (page 29) is set to “On”, the TV automatically selects the best mode to suit the broadcast.
- If 720p, 1080i or 1080p source pictures are displayed with black borders on the screen edges, select “Wide Zoom” or “Zoom” to adjust the pictures.

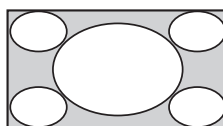
## For PC input

### Full 1



Stretches the original picture to fill the screen vertically.

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## Viewing Pictures from Connected Equipment

Turn on the connected equipment, then press / to display a list of connected equipment. Press / to select the desired input source, then press .

The highlighted item is automatically selected if you do not perform any operation for two seconds after pressing / .

If you have set an input source to “Skip” in the “Video Labels” menu (page 30), that input source does not appear in the list.



- To return to normal TV mode, press **DIGITAL/ANALOG**.

### To view two pictures simultaneously – Twin Picture

You can view two pictures (external input and TV programme) on the screen simultaneously. Connect an optional equipment (page 20), and make sure that images from the equipment appear on the screen (page 22).



- This function is not available for a PC input.
- You cannot change the size of the pictures.
- The analogue TV video in the TV programme picture will not appear while displaying Video 1, Video 2 or Video 3 in the external input picture. However, you can hear the analogue video’s sound.

### To view two pictures simultaneously – PIP (Picture in Picture)

You can view two pictures (PC input and TV programme) on the screen simultaneously. Connect a PC (page 20), and make sure that images from the PC appear on the screen.



- “Power Management” (page 30) is not available in PIP mode.

- 1 Press .

The picture from the connected PC is displayed in full size, and the TV programme is displayed in the small screen.

You can use / / / to change the position of the TV programme screen.

- 2 Press the number buttons or **PROG +/-** to select a TV channel.

**To return to single picture mode**

Press **RETURN**.



- You can switch the audible picture by selecting “Audio Swap” from the Options menu.

## Using USB Photo Viewer

You can view photographs (in JPEG format) stored in a Sony digital still camera, camcorder through a USB cable or USB storage media on your TV.

- When you connect a Sony digital still camera, set the camera’s USB connection mode to Auto or “Mass Storage”. For more information about USB connection mode, refer to the instructions supplied with your digital camera.
- USB Photo Viewer supports FAT32 file system only.
- While the TV is accessing the data on the recording media, observe the following:
  - Do not turn off the TV or connected USB device.
  - Do not disconnect the USB cable.

### To display a fixed photograph — Picture Frame

You can display a fixed photograph on the screen for a selected period of time. After that period, the TV automatically switches itself into standby mode.

- 1 Connect a supported USB device to the TV.
- 2 Press **HOME**.
- 3 Press  $\leftarrow/\rightarrow$  to select “Photo”, then press  $\uparrow/\downarrow$  to select “Picture Frame” and press  $\oplus$ .
- 4 Press **OPTIONS**, then press  $\uparrow/\downarrow$  to select “Image selection” and press  $\oplus$ .  
The thumbnail screen appears.
- 5 Press  $\uparrow/\downarrow/\leftarrow/\rightarrow$  to select the photograph you want to display, then press  $\heartsuit$ .  
The selected photograph is displayed on the screen.
- 6 Press **RETURN** to go back to the XMB™.

- If the photograph is selected from a USB device, it must remain connected to the TV.
- If “Sleep Timer” is activated, the TV automatically will switch into standby mode.

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## Using BRAVIA Sync (Control for HDMI)

The control for HDMI function enables the TV to communicate with the connected equipment that is compatible with the function, using HDMI CEC (Consumer Electronics Control). For example, by connecting Sony equipment that is compatible with control for HDMI (with HDMI cables), you can control them together.

Be sure to connect the equipment correctly, and make the necessary settings.

### Control for HDMI

- Automatically turns the connected equipment off when you switch the TV to standby mode using the remote.
- Automatically turns the TV on and switches the input to the connected equipment when the equipment starts to play.
- If you turn on a connected audio system while the TV is on, the sound output switches from the TV speaker to the audio system.
- Adjusts the volume ( $\triangleleft$  +/-) and mutes the sound ( $\text{M}$ ) of a connected audio system.
- You can operate the connected Sony equipment that has the BRAVIA Sync logo by the TV remote by pressing:
  - $\blacktriangleright$ / $\blacksquare$ / $\blacksquare$ / $\blacktriangleleft$ / $\blacktriangleleft$ / $\blacktriangleright$  to operate the connected equipment directly.
  - **SYNC MENU** to display the menu of the connected HDMI equipment on the screen. After displaying the menu, you can operate the menu screen by using  $\blacktriangleleft$ / $\blacktriangleright$ / $\blacktriangleleft$ / $\blacktriangleright$  and  $\oplus$ .
  - **OPTIONS** to display “Device Control”, then select options from “Menu”, “Options”, and “Content List” to operate the equipment.
  - Refer to the instruction manual of the equipment for available control.

### To connect the equipment that is compatible with control for HDMI

Connect the compatible equipment and the TV with an HDMI cable. When connecting an audio system, be sure to also connect the DIGITAL AUDIO OUT (OPTICAL) jack of the TV and the audio system using an optical audio cable. For details, see page 20.

### To make the control for HDMI settings

The control for HDMI settings must be set on both the TV side and connected equipment side. See “HDMI Set-up” on page 31 for the TV side settings. For settings on the connected equipment, refer to the operating instructions for that equipment.

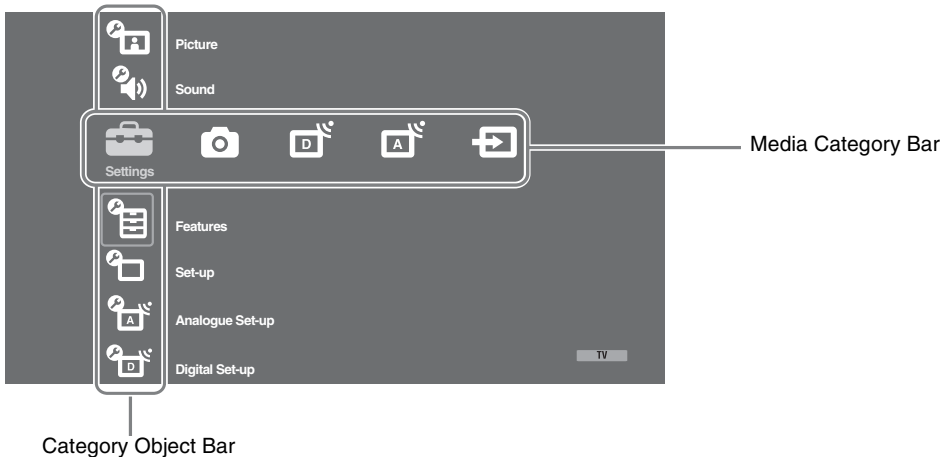

## Navigating through TV Home Menu on XMB™

The XMB™ (XrossMediaBar) is a menu of BRAVIA features and input sources displayed on the TV screen. The XMB™ is an easy way to select programming and adjust settings on your BRAVIA TV.

- 1 Press **HOME** to display the XMB™.



- 2 Press  $\leftarrow/\rightarrow$  to select the category.



<b>Display Mode</b>	Sets a display mode when displaying a PC input.
<b>Video</b>	For video images.
<b>Text</b>	For text, charts or tables.
<b>Reset</b>	Resets all the “Picture” settings to the factory settings excluding “Picture Mode” and “Display Mode”.
<b>Backlight</b>	Adjusts the brightness of the backlight.
<b>Picture</b>	Increases or decreases picture contrast.
<b>Brightness</b>	Brightens or darkens the picture.
<b>Colour</b>	Increases or decreases colour intensity.
<b>Hue</b>	Increases or decreases the green tones and red tones.  <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• “Hue” can be adjusted only for the NTSC colour system (e.g. U.S.A. video tapes).</li></ul>
<b>Colour Temperature</b>	Adjusts the whiteness of the picture.
<b>Cool</b>	Gives white colours a blue tint.
<b>Neutral</b>	Gives white colours a neutral tint.
<b>Warm 1/Warm 2</b>	Gives white colours a red tint. “Warm 2” gives a redder tint than “Warm 1”.

<b>Sharpness</b>	Sharpens or softens the picture.

<b>Intelligent Volume</b>	Keeps volume level constant across all programmes and adverts (e.g. adverts tend to be louder than programmes).
<b>Volume Offset</b>	Sets an independent volume level to each equipment connected to the TV.
<b>Surround</b>	<p><b>S-FORCE Front Surround</b> Available for normal stereo broadcast and 5.1ch broadcast surround audio, and the audio input from connected equipment.</p> <p><b>Simulated Stereo</b> Adds a surround-like effect to mono programmes.</p> <p><b>Off</b> Converts and reproduces 5.1ch and other broadcast surround audio as normal stereo audio (2ch). 

## When the (standby) indicator is flashing

The self-diagnosis function is activated.

- 1 Count how many times the  (standby) indicator flashes between each two second break.  
For example, the indicator may flash three times, go off for two seconds, then flash again three times.
- 2 Press  on the TV to turn it off, disconnect the AC power cord, and inform your dealer or Sony service centre of how the indicator flashes (number of flashes).

## When the (standby) indicator is not flashing

- 1 Check the items in the tables below.
- 2 If the problem persists, have your TV serviced by qualified service personnel.
